WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 13, 1934 shows a decrease of 1,942,468 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 220,823,304 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 222,765,772 bushels for the previous week and 224,362,050 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 3,317,633 bushels of which 426,004 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,667,362 bushels at New York and 1,498,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 4,896,843 bushels on the same date last year of which 3,740,278 bushels were located at Buffalo, 138,822 bushels at New York and 280,819 bushels at Boston.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,228,643 bushels compared with 6,319,030 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 6, 1934 amounted to 2,173,112 bushels, an increase of 173,842 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 1,999,270 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 2,556,368 bushels were marketed. For the thirty-six weeks ending April 6, 1934 and April 7, 1933, 190,656,416 bushels and 322,148,738 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending April 6, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1933: Manitoba 247,400 (165,412) bushels; Saskatchewan 1,107,564 (1,229,363) bushels; Alberta 818,148 (1,161,593) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to April 6, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 24,873,944 (32,890,470) bushels; Saskatchewan 94,088,628 (164,119,041) bushels; Alberta 71,693,844 (125,139,227) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending April 13, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,226,498 bushels compared with 1,969,149 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1933, 2,135,460 bushels were cleared for overseas ports. This is the first time since the week ending January 19, 1934, that the weekly clearances of this year have exceeded those of the same week a year ago.


World shipments for the week ending April 16, amounted to 10,714,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,119,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,424,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America and Australia increased slightly during the past week. Clearances from the Argentina showed an increase of 1,888,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-seven weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.2 million bushels per week during the first thirty-seven weeks of the crop year as compared with 12.3 and 15.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 6.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-seven weeks of 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.5 million bushels per week as compared with 2.1 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 13, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 13, 1934 show a net decrease of 2,873,724 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 220,823,304, oats 15,275,903, barley 10,393,357, flaxseed 557,356 and rye 4,230,391 bushels, a total of 251,280,311 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,942,468 and oats 1,025,669 bushels while increases are shown in barley of 6,888, flaxseed 9,934 and rye 77,591 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 224,362,050, oats 11,926,357, barley 6,572,899, flaxseed 1,302,482 and rye 5,129,780 bushels a total of 249,293,568 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 1,060,200 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 737,048, oats 293,506 and barley 32,134 bushels while increases are shown in flaxseed and rye of 342 and 2,146 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 134,220 bushels. Decreases noted were wheat 21,064, oats 111,442 and barley 2,762 bushels while flaxseed increased 1,048 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 728,873 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat and oats of 544,992 and 189,313 bushels respectively while barley increased 5,432 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Oats decreased 59 bushels.

VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain stocks show a net increase of 587,819 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 575,428, barley 38,361 and flaxseed 1,727 bushels while oats decreased 27,697 bushels.






