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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 27, 1934 shows a decrease of 5,402,497 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 208,873,682 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 214,276,179 bushels for the previous week and 219,806,848 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 1,518,955 bushels of which 98,980 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 380,068 bushels at New York and 905,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 2,498,126 bushels on the same date last year of which 2,040,180 bushels were located at Buffalo and 42,488 bushels at New York. This is the smallest quantity of Canadian wheat in United States positions for a number of years.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2,228,460 bushels compared with 5,383,801 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 20, 1934 amounted to 1,981,649 bushels, an increase of 247,825 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 1,733,824 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 2,647,944 bushels were marketed. For the thirty-eight weeks ending April 20, 1934 and April 21, 1933, 194,371,889 bushels and 326,839,276 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending April 20, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1933: Manitoba 217,828 (147,850) bushels; Saskatchewan 896,218 (1,392,511) bushels; Alberta 867,603 (1,107,583) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to April 20, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 25,165,502 (33,172,765) bushels; Saskatchewan 95,887,921 (166,534,195) bushels; Alberta 73,318,466 (127,132,716) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending April 27, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,725,608 bushels compared with 1,497,598 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1933, 4,456,698 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.




World shipments for the week ending April 30, 1934 amounted to 8,012,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 8,151,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,616,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America were slightly higher this week as compared with the previous week. Clearances from the Argentino showed an increase of 330,000 bushels while Australian shipments were lower than last week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-nine weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.2 million bushels per week during the first thirty-nine weeks of the crop year as compared with 12.3 and 15.4 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 5.9 million bushels per week during the first thirty-nine weeks of 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.5 million bushels per week as compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 27, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 27, 1934 show a decrease of 6,461,834 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 208,873,682, oats 13,013,812, barley 9,910,169, flaxseed 545,020 and rye 3,940,062 bushels a total of 236,282,745 bushels. Decreases were made up as follows:- wheat 5,402,497, oats 811,501, barley 225,705, flaxseed 142 and rye 21,989 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 219,806,848, oats 10,700,239, barley 6,504,870, flaxseed 1,383,876 and rye 5,169,051 bushels, a total of 243,564,884 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks this week decreased 4,216,555 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 3,453,960, oats 596,601, barley 146,876, flaxseed 1,229 and rye 17,889 bushels.


