WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 4, 1934 shows a decrease of 4,357,397 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 202,957,764 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 207,315,161 bushels for the previous week and 215,906,285 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 895,321 bushels of which 68,360 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 216,054 bushels at New York and 476,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 3,035,931 bushels on the same date last year of which 2,354,480 bushels were located at Buffalo and 81,953 bushels at New York.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,266,426 bushels compared with 4,986,858 bushels last year.

For the first time this year wheat in transit is reported, the amount being 1,271,277 bushels. For the same date last year the quantity was 7,461,242 bushels. In transit wheat was reported last year for the first time for the week ending April 21.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 27, 1934 amounted to 1,536,396 bushels, a decrease of 445,253 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 1,981,649 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1933, 2,749,600 bushels were marketed. For the thirty-nine weeks ending April 27, 1934 and April 28, 1933 195,908,283 bushels and 329,589,276 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending April 27, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1933: Manitoba 90,066 (296,310) bushels; Saskatchewan 817,005 (1,403,658) bushels; Alberta 629,325 (1,049,632) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to April 27, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 25,255,567 (33,469,075) bushels; Saskatchewan 96,704,926 (167,937,853) bushels; Alberta 73,947,791 (128,182,348) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending May 4, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,904,233 bushels compared with 1,725,608 bushels for the previous week. During the corresponding week in 1933, 4,258,265 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending May 7, 1934 amounted to 9,222,000 bushels, as compared with shipments of 8,012,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,584,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America and Australia were slightly higher this week as compared with the previous week while Argentine shipments were lower than last week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first forty weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first forty weeks of the crop year as compared with 12.3 and 15.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 5.8 million bushels per week during the first forty weeks of 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.5 million bushels per week as compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period in the last crop year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 4, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 4, 1934 show a decrease of 4,921,174 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 202,957,764, oats 12,171,318, barley 9779,391, flaxseed 526740 and rye 3,896,064 bushels, a total of 229,331,277 bushels. Decreases were made up as follows:- wheat 4,357,397, oats 505,100, barley 21,269, flaxseed 14,639 and rye 22,769 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 215,906,285, oats 10,471,613, barley 6,488,501, flaxseed 1,419,435 and rye 5,093,553 bushels, a total of 239,379,387 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 3,930,554 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 3,587,815, oats 235,653, barley 85,939, flaxseed 11,148 and rye 9,999 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 130,182 bushels made up of wheat 10,018, oats 118,609 and barley 1,555 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 93,748 bushels. Wheat and oats decreased 91,519 and 17,366 bushels respectively while barley increased 15,137 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks increased 324,680 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 237,019, barley 88,072 and rye 11,508 bushels while decreases are shown in oats of 11,044 and flaxseed 875 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit increased 1,380,030 bushels made up of wheat 1,271,277 and oats 108,753 bushels.


