WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 8, 1934 shows a slight decrease of 329,984 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 200,006,058 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 200,336,042 bushels for the previous week and 193,060,217 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,613,977 bushels of which 4,923,888 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 125,984 bushels at New York and 1,540,000 bushels at Erie. This compared with 4,284,757 bushels on the same date last year of which 1,912,143 bushels were located at Buffalo, 635,595 bushels at New York and 1,667,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 3 bushels compared with 4,452,071 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,713,718 bushels compared with 2,883,926 bushels for the previous week and 3,949,852 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 1, 1934 amounted to 3,426,654 bushels, an increase of 1,608,178 bushels over the previous week when 1,818,476 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 5,274,680 bushels. For the Forty-four weeks ending June 1, 1934 and June 2, 1933, 205,038,900 bushels and 341,890,360 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 1, 1934 were as follows figures within brackets being those for the same week in 1933: Manitoba 402,249 (399,677) bushels; Saskatchewan 1,762,302 (1,419,806) bushels; Alberta 1,262,103 (1,876,995) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to June 1, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures in brackets being those for 1932-33; Manitoba 26,313,102 (35,042,211) bushels; Saskatchewan 101,138,941 (173,411,138) bushels; Alberta 77,586,857 (133,437,011).

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending June 8, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,309,768 bushels compared with 2,721,933 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 412,165 bushels.

EXPORTS VIA SHIPPING ROUTES

Wheat Exports - Month of May, 1934

According to Canadian Customs returns 19,023,770 bushels of wheat valued at \$13,562,154 were exported from Canada during the month of May, 1934. This compared with 21,464,848 bushels valued \$13,064,791 bushels for the same month in 1933. The routing of the exports during May, 1934 shows that 61,073 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption while 7,479,281 bushels were exported to the United States for export overseas. The balance amounting to 11,483,416 bushels were exported from Canadian seaboard ports 8,949,019 bushels moving from Atlantic ports and 2,534,397 bushels from Pacific ports. Re-routed wheat during the month of May amounted to 81,000 bushels.

Wheat Exports - Ten months ending May, 1934.

Exports during the ten months ending May, 1934 amounted to 138,828,849 bushels valued at \$96,218,277 compared with 206,764,364 bushels with value of \$110,897,805 for the same period in 1933. Of the former amount 218,785 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption, 33,064,251 bushels moved out via United States ports, 62,358,459 bushels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports, 40,479,475 bushels via Canadian Pacific ports and 2,707,879 bushels via Port of Churchill, Manitoba, making a total via Canadian ports of 105,545,813 bushels.

The re-routed wheat from United States Lake ports to Canadian ports amounted to 1,203,533 bushels which increases the movement via Canadian ports to 106,749,346 bushels and decreases the exports via United States ports to 31,860,718 bushels.

Wheat flour Exports - Month of May, 1934.

During the month of May, 1934 551 barrels of wheat flour were exported to the United States direct for consumption, 35,907 barrels moved via United States ports for exports overseas, and 359,627 barrels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports while 85,640 bushels were exported from Canadian Pacific ports. The total export for the month amounted to 481,725 barrels valued at \$1,652,024 compared with 565,080 barrels valued at \$1,735,078 during the same month in 1933.

Wheat flour Exports - Ten months ended May, 1934.

Wheat flour exports during the ten months ending May, 1934 show an increase over the same period in 1933. The number of barrels exported for the ten month period in 1934 was 4,605,544 barrels valued at \$16,467,461 compared with 4,333,341 barrels valued at \$13,490,186, for the same ten months in 1933, an increase in quantity of 272,203 barrels in value of \$2,977,275.

Exports via Canadian Atlantic ports amounted to 3,188,761 barrels, via Canadian Pacific Ports 1,020,959 barrels while 392,472 barrels were exported to the United States ports for export overseas and 3,352 barrels were shipped to the United States for consumption.

Wheat and Wheat flour - Exports combined for the month of May, 1934

The combined exports of wheat and wheatflour, (the latter reduced to bushels at $4\frac{1}{2}$ to the barrel) amounted to 21,191,533 bushels compared with 24,007,708 bushels for the same month in 1933. Of the former amount 63,533 bushels went to the United States for consumption, 7,640,862 bushels were exported to the United States for export overseas 10,567,341 bushels were moved direct from Canadian Atlantic ports and 2,919,777 bushels were shipped overseas from the Canadian Pacific ports, making a total via Canadian ports of 13,487,118 bushels. Re-routed wheat from United States lake ports during the month of May was reported as 81,000 bushels, which added to the movement via Canadian ports increased same to 13,568,118 bushels. Deduction of same amount from United States ports decreases the quantity to be exported from United States Atlantic ports to 7,559,862 bushels.

Wheat and Wheat flour - Ten months ending May, 1934.

Exports of wheat and wheat flour in bushels for the ten months ending May, 1934 and 1933 amounted to 159,553,798 and 226,264,400 bushels respectively. The routing of the first amount was as follows:- 233,871 bushels moved into the United States direct, 34,830,376 bushels were shipped to the United States for export overseas, 76,707,883 bushels were exported direct from Canadian Atlantic ports, 45,073,789 bushels were shipped from Canadian Pacific ports and 2,707,879 bushels moved from Churchill, Manitoba. The re-routed wheat amounted to 1,203,533 bushels which increased the Canadian Atlantic exports to 77,911,416 bushels and decreased the amount routed via United States ports to 33,626,844 bushels via United States ports.

Coarse Grain Exports


Oats exported during the month May, 1934 amounted to 881,246 bushels and 4,568,358 bushels for the ten months ending May, 1934. The former figures include 954 bushels and the latter 46,488 bushels exported direct to the United States for consumption, the balance of the export moved from Canadian seaboard ports to overseas countries, 1,875,181 bushels via Atlantic and 2,646,689 bushels via Pacific Ports.

Barley exports amounted to only 75,772 bushels during the month of May and 1,084,998 bushels for the ten months ending May, 1934. Of the first amount all but 12 bushels were exported overseas via Canadian ports. For the ten months export, 1,081,991 bushels moved from Canada via Canadian ports, while 3,007 bushels was exported to the United States direct.

Rye exports for the month of May amounted to only 17,142 bushels leaving Canada via Canadian Atlantic ports. During the ten months 2,562,494 bushels were exported, the bulk of which was shipped to the United States, the amount being 2,345,771 bushels some 121,877 bushels were shipped to overseas countries via United States ports, 94,288 bushels via Atlantic ports and 618 bushels via Pacific ports.

Flaxseed exported for the month of May amounted to only 29 bushels from Canadian Atlantic ports. The ten month exports amounted to 187,403 bushels, 182,740 bushels going to the United States direct, 4,627 bushels to Atlantic ports and 36 bushels from Pacific ports.

Imports of wheat from Canada into United States for milling in bond for the period from August 5, 1933 to June 2, 1934 amounted to 8,751,000 bushels which added to 133,537,207 bushels cleared from Canadian and United States seaboard makes 142,288,207 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 11, 1934 amounted to 10,528,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 1,779,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,680,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. North American and Australian shipments decreased slightly during the past week while shipments from the Argentine showed an increase of 2,852,000 bushels over the previous week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first forty-five weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first forty-five weeks of the crop year as compared with 12.2 and 15.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 5.8 million bushels per week during the first forty-five weeks of 1932-33.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 8, 1934

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 8, 1934 show a decrease of 386,959 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 200,006,058, oats 10,671,493, barley 9,177,136 flaxseed 504,105 and rye 3,895,147 bushels, a total of 224,253,939 bushels. Decreases noted were as follows:- wheat 329,984, oats 10,251, barley 34,258, flaxseed 2,852 and rye 9,614 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 193,060,217, oats 9,637,409, barley 6,271,790, flaxseed 1,051,205 and rye 5,142,688 bushels, a total of 215,163,309 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 159,515 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 267,386 and flaxseed 3,857 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 76,863, barley 31,257 and rye 3,608 bushels.


