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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 29, 1934 shows a decrease of 1,702,363 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 191,710,072 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 193,412,435 bushels for the previous week and 199,112,746 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,120,973 bushels of which 7,431,954 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,003,914 bushels at New York, 1,540,000 bushels at Erie and 141,000 at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 4,336,627 bushels on the same date last year of which 1,749,338 bushels were located at Buffalo, 890,154 bushels at New York and 1,667,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with 4,047,400 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,058,516 bushels compared with 4,498,267 bushels for the previous week and 3,195,990 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 22, 1934 amounted to 2,651,264 bushels, a small decrease of 281,329 bushels from the previous week when 2,932,593 were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,565,657 bushels. For the forty-seven weeks ending June 22, 1934 and June 23, 1933, 214,336,793 bushels and 356,742,219 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 22, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the same week ending June 23, 1933: Manitoba 329,853 (715,797) bushels; Saskatchewan 1,175,196 (2,072,322) bushels; Alberta 1,146,215 (1,777,533) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to June 22, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 27,504,736 (36,907,856) bushels; Saskatchewan 105,460,073 (180,485,507) bushels; Alberta 81,371,984 (139,348,856) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending June 29, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,414,354 bushels compared with 2,585,609 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 828,745 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending July 2, 1934 amounted to 10,705,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,482,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,192,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. North American shipments showed a decrease of 1,172,000 bushels this week as compared with last while shipments from the Argentine and Australia were slightly higher.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first forty-eight weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first forty-eight weeks of the crop year as compared with 12.0 and 15.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.3 million bushels per week compared with 5.7 million bushels per week during the first forty-eight weeks of 1932-33.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 29, 1934

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 29, 1934 show a net decrease of 1,720,324 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 191,710,072, oats 10,307,846, barley 9,137,109, flaxseed 473,050 and rye 3,860,647 bushels a total of 215,488,724 bushels. Decreases were shown in wheat of 1,702,363, oats 1,707, flaxseed 17,567 and rye 3,303 bushels while barley increased 4,616 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 199,112,746, oats 10,307,915, barley 6,952,134, flaxseed 1,127,265 and rye 5,284,283 bushels, a total of 222,784,343 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,567,718 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,536,144, oats 35,185, flaxseed 18,411 and rye 18,233 bushels while barley increased 40,255 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 5,135 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 52,846 and oats 14,227 bushels while barley and flaxseed decreased 61,910 and 28 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 33,017 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 75,869, and barley 8,805 bushels while oats increased 51,657 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store decreased 167 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store decreased 334 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 2,183,169 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,600,520, oats 191,629 and barley 414,206 bushels while increases are shown in flaxseed and rye of 762 and 22,418 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 335,002 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 409,751 and barley 35,318 bushels while oats increased 110,067 bushels.




