WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE.

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 6, 1934 shows a decrease of 372,424 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 189,186,468 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 189,558,892 bushels for the previous week and 201,391,708 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,448,727 bushels of which 6,558,013 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,048,529 bushels at New York 1,615,000 bushels at Erie and 141,000 at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 5,131,215 bushels on the same date last year of which 2,342,550 bushels were located at Buffalo 1,076,509 bushels at New York and 1,667,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with 3,950,798 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 2,727,219 bushels compared with 3,088,516 bushels for the previous week and 4,093,383 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 29, 1934 amounted to 2,138,546 bushels, a decrease of 512,718 bushels from the previous week when 2,651,264 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 3,476,705 bushels. For the forty-eight weeks ending June 29, 1934 and June 30, 1933, 216,475,339 bushels and 360,218,924 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 29, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending June 30, 1933: Manitoba 249,236 (367,419) bushels; Saskatchewan 959,077 (1,853,835) bushels; Alberta 930,233 (1,255,451) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to June 29, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 27,753,972 (37,275,275) bushels; Saskatchewan 106,419,150, (182,339,342) bushels; Alberta 82,302,217 (140,604,307) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending July 6, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,899,754 bushels compared with 3,414,354 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,514,600 bushels.


World shipments for the week ending July 9, 1934 amounted to 8,505,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,705,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,016,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932-33. Shipments from North America and the Argentine decreased slightly during the past week. Australian Shipments showed a decrease of 1,299,000 bushels.

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first forty-nine weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.

As shown by the above table world shipments of wheat averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first forty-nine weeks of the crop year as compared with 11.9 and 15.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.2 million bushels per week compared with 5.7 million bushels per week during the first forty-nine weeks of 1932-33.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 6, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 6, 1934 show a decrease of 844,190 bushels. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 189,186,468, oats 10,072,187, barley 9,037,876, flaxseed 453,882 and rye 3,624,484 bushels a total of 212,374,897 bushels. Decreases noted were as follows:- wheat 372,424, oats 191,051, barley 21,894, flaxseed 19,633 and rye 239,188 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 201,391,708, oats 11,062,345, barley 7,263,669 flaxseed 1,125,124 and rye 5,565,304 bushels, a total of 226,408,150 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain shows a net decrease of 2,194,779 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 2,190,321, flaxseed 23,272 and rye 24,969 bushels while oats and barley increased 5,404 and 38,379 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 243,839 bushels. Wheat stocks increased 275,043 bushels while decreases are noted in oats and rye of 31,144 and 60 bushels respectively.


VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 294,704 bushels. Wheat decreased 331,370 bushels while oats and barley increased 21,945 and 14,721 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 333 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks of grain show a net increase of 340,414 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 631,347 and oats 38,876 bushels while decreases are shown in barley of 95,436, flaxseed 26,361 and rye 208,012 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 466,364 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 361,297, oats 119,866 and barley 15,201 bushels while flaxseed increased 30,000 bushels.
