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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 29, 1933 shows an increase of 7,776,318 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported at 226,218,782 bushels compared with a revised figure of 218,442,464 bushels for the previous week and 198,239,902 bushels for the corresponding week in 1932. The 1933 visible supply continues to increase more slowly than the 1932 visible at the same period of the year.

Canadian wheat in store in the United States amounted to 5,752,064 bushels compared with 10,987,450 bushels on the same date last year.

In transit wheat on the Great Lakes amounted to 7,485,969 bushels on September 29. On September 30, 1932, 9,965,907 bushels were in transit on the lakes.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 3,114,384 bushels compared with 8,502,625 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT OF WHEAT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 22 amounted to 12,044,480 bushels, a decrease of 2,905,000 bushels compared with those of the previous week when 14,949,480 bushels were marketed. During the same week in 1932, 34,592,823 bushels were reported. For the eight weeks ending September 22, 1933, and September 23, 1932, 64,652,262 bushels and 114,179,433 bushels, respectively, were received from the farms.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending September 29, 1933, the export clearances amounted to 3,813,376 bushels compared with 3,887,203 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 75,827 bushels. During the corresponding week in 1932, 7,218,288 bushels were cleared for overseas ports.

World shipments for the week ending October 2 amounted to 9,680,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 12,091,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,088,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Russia decreased by more than half a million bushels while Argentine shipments show a decrease of over seven hundred thousand bushels.

During the first nine weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 91 million bushels compared with 84 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments have amounted to 38 million bushels compared with 51 million bushels last year. Since August 1, 1933 the Argentine has cleared 24 million bushels of wheat compared with 7 million for the same weeks last year. Australian shipments have also been slightly heavier than last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first nine weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1932-33 and 1931-32.


As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first nine weeks of the crop year as compared with 9.4 and 16.0 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1932-33 and 1931-32. North American shipments have averaged 4.2 million bushels per week compared with 5.7 and 6.0 million bushels per week during the first nine weeks of 1932-33 and 1931-32. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.7 million bushels per week as compared with .8 million bushels during the same period last year.

SPAIN

The 1933 Spanish wheat crop is now estimated at 132 million bushels compared with a preliminary estimate of 142 million bushels. In 1932 wheat production in Spain amounted to 184 million bushels. Spain is one of the few countries in Europe where production in 1933 is sharply lower than in 1932. The 1932 yield constituted a record crop for Spain and the past crop year ended with a relatively large carry-over.

EUROPEAN PRODUCTION

Production of wheat in Europe in 1933 will amount to about 1,615 million bushels which compares with about 1,477,000 million bushels for 1932. The largest increases compared with last year occur in the Danubian countries where production in 1933 is over 100 million bushels larger than in 1932.



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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 29, 1933.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 29, 1933 show a net increase of 8,637,046 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows wheat 226,218,782, oats 15,392,520, barley 10,622,823, flaxseed 983,614 and rye 4,946,904 bushels, a total of 258,664,643 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 7,776,318, oats 733,951, barley 270,876, and flaxseed 13,860 bushels while rye decreased 157,959 bushels. At a comparable date last year, stocks in store were as follows: wheat 198,239,902, oats 7,213,300, barley 5,812,582, flaxseed 1,399,910 and rye 5,359,063 bushels, a total of 218,034,157 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks in store at these elevators show a net increase of 5,101,492 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 4,716,850, oats 296,397, barley 102,758 and flaxseed 15,386 bushels while rye decreased 29,899 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 807,312 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 704,652, oats 74,973 and barley 27,687 bushels.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 594,697 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 560,560, barley 11,057 and flaxseed 107 bushels while oats and rye decreased 62,027 and 15,000 bushels respectively.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks increased 322,825 bushels, made up of wheat 322,467 and oats 358 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks increased 250,065 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks in store decreased 2,785,984 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,165,311, barley 25,734 and rye 702,665 bushels while increases are shown in oats and flaxseed of 507,369 and 357 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit increased 3,673,810 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,871,447 and barley 207,862 bushels while oats decreased 5,499 bushels.
