

Official Carryover of Wheat

The total stocks of Canadian wheat in Canada at July 31, 1934 are placed at 193,322,863 bushels - 18,417,325 bushels less than last year's total of 211,740,188 bushels.

Canadian wheat in elevators and afloat in the United States amounted to 9,954,252 bushels. The comparable figure for this item at July 31, 1933 was 6,220,210 bushels.

The total amount of Canadian wheat in Canada and the United States at July 31, 1934 was 203,277,115 bushels, compared with 219,428,398 bushels, the revised total for July 31, 1933.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 3, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 3, 1934 show increase of 1,614,745 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 187,349,709, oats 10,396,092, barley 9,050,953 flaxseed 450,280 and rye 3,858,965 bushels a total of 211,105,999 bushels. Increases were made up as follows:-wheat 1,939,332, and rye 231,141 bushels while decreases are noted in oats of 172,408, barley 379,364 and flaxseed 3,956. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 196,180,392; oats 12,689,574, barley 7,818,805, flaxseed 1,110,691 and rye 5,635,323 bushels a total of 223,434,785 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- A net decrease is noted in stocks of grains at these elevators. Decreases are shown in wheat of 1,091,849, oats 112,314, barley 75,656 bushels while flaxseed and rye increased 1,611 and 8,109 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 381 bushels. Wheat stocks show an increase of 2,713 bushels while oats decreased 3,094 bushels from the previous week.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 18,334 bushels. Wheat and barley show increases of 40,491 and 7,024 bushels respectively, while decreases took place in oats of 26,713 and 2,468 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Stocks remained the same as previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Stocks remained the same as previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Stocks remained the same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,354,189 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 1,077,788 bushels, oats 132,209 bushels, flaxseed 21,257 and rye 237,440 bushels. While barley decreased 114,330 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit show a net decrease of 236,606 bushels from the previous week. Wheat increased 270,755 bushels while decreases are noted in oats of 196,401 bushels barley 283,944 bushels and rye 27,016 bushels.
