WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 5, 1934 shows an increase of 1,635,061 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 230,179,344 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 228,544,283 bushels for the previous week and 235,246,382 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 14,975,169 bushels of which 8,721,481 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 892,218 bushels at New York, 1,977,000 bushels at Erie and 2,832,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 6,541,114 bushels on the same date last year of which 3,770,349 bushels were located at Buffalo, 756,384 bushels at New York and 1,996,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 848,620 bushels compared with 2,991,168 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,336,501 bushels compared with 3,084,772 bushels for the previous week and 6,290,618 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 28, 1934 amounted to 5,308,972 bushels, less than half of those for the previous week when 10,771,408 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 14,325,654 bushels. For the nine weeks ending September 28, 1934 and September 29, 1933, 85,746,318 bushels and 78,977,916 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 6,768,402 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 28, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending September 29, 1933: Manitoba 309,167 (835,541) Saskatchewan 3,599,281 (8,179,037); Alberta 1,400,524 (5,511,076) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to September 28, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 21,423,303 (17,761,241); Saskatchewan 40,478,944 (38,927,520); Alberta 35,344,071 (22,289,155) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 5, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 4,199,112 bushels compared with 3,036,333 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,162,779 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 9, 1934 amounted to 11,761,000 bushels compared with shipments of 11,314,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,056,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and the Argentine showed increases of 692,000 and 661,000 bushels respectively while Australian shipments decreased 1,178,000 bushels.

During the first ten weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 107 million bushels compared with 102 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were slightly lower than last year. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 40 million bushels of wheat compared with 25 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first ten weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.7 million bushels per week during the first ten weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 and 9.9 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 4.1 million bushels per week compared with 4.3 and 6.1 million bushels per week during the first ten weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 4.0 million bushels per week as compared with 2.5 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCT. 5, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Oct. 5, 1934 show a net increase of 2,622,902 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 230,179,344, oats 12,231,037, barley 14,243,382, flaxseed 492,298 and rye 4,127,430 bushels, a total of 261,273,491 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,635,061, oats 243,877, barley 691,051 and rye 63,139 bushels while flaxseed decreased 10,226 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 235,246,382, oats 16,811,342, barley 11,079,617, flaxseed 1,025,598 and rye 5,018,620 bushels, a total of 269,181,559 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net increase of 3,073,850 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,504,570, oats 501,799, barley 57,088 and flaxseed 12,014 bushels while rye decreased 1,621 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a net increase of 201,809 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 183,238 and barley 22,367 bushels while oats decreased 3,796 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 692,109 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 554,574, oats 118,811 and barley, 18,848 bushels while flaxseed increased 124 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks show a decrease of 244,130 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks of grain show a net decrease of 972,990 bushels. Wheat decreased 1,382,165 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 87,273, barley 294,737, flaxseed 6,907 and rye 20,258 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES. - Grain in transit shows a net increase of 233,949 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 251,729 and barley 190,731 bushels while decreases are shown in oats and rye of 176,503 and 32,008 bushels respectively.
