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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 19, 1934 shows an increase of 7,869,834 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 245,446,953 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 237,577,119 bushels for the previous week and 245,240,584 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,771,567 bushels of which 11,206,415 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 882,737 bushels at New York, 1,977,000 bushels at Erie and 3,147,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 7,554,901 bushels on the same date last year of which 4,580,140 bushels were located at Buffalo, 1,289,380 bushels at New York and 1,667,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 848,620 bushels compared with 2,791,878 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,980,213 bushels compared with 3,332,665 bushels for the previous week and 3,719,976 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 12, 1934, amounted to 15,440,267 bushels, almost doubling the amount of the previous week when 8,457,256 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 14,109,483 bushels. For the eleven weeks ending October 12, 1934 and October 13, 1933, 109,643,841 and 107,915,965 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 1,727,876 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 12, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending October 13, 1933: Manitoba 1,072,379 (601,997); Saskatchewan 6,380,893 (7,300,587); Alberta 7,986,995 (6,206,899) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to October 12, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 22,922,166 (19,431,274); Saskatchewan 52,089,406 (53,953,978); Alberta 34,632,269 (34,530,713) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending October 19, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,675,705 bushels compared with 2,308,714 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 366,991 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 22, 1934 amounted to 9,088,000 bushels compared with shipments of 11,622,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,784,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed an increase of 1,150,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while decreases were noted in Argentine and Australian shipments of 1,487,000 and 1,549,000 bushels respectively.


During the first twelve weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 128 million bushels compared with 122 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American Shipments were lower than last year, while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 47 million bushels of wheat compared with 28 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twelve weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.6 million bushels per week during the first twelve weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.0 and 10.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 4.0 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.5 million bushels per week during the first twelve weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.9 million bushels per week as compared with 2.3 million bushels during the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 19, 1934

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 19, 1934 show a net increase of 8,329,188 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 245,446,953, oats 13,649,643, barley 14,429,585, flaxseed 582,927 and rye 3,902,817 bushels, a total of 278,011,925 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 7,869,834, oats 535,970, barley 70,219 and flaxseed 25,986 bushels, while rye decreased 172,821 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 245,240,584, oats 18,523,807, barley 11,878,785, flaxseed 1,101,555 and rye 4,981,657 bushels, a total of 281,726,388 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks this week show a net increase of 3,225,812 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,768,243, oats 470,510, barley 26,897 and flaxseed 19,379 bushels while rye decreased 59,217 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.
