WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 26, 1934 shows an increase of 4,095,379 bushels as compared with the previous week, and 631,533 bushels over the same week in 1933. The visible supply was reported as 249,639,350 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 245,533,971 bushels for the previous week and 249,007,817 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,213,477 bushels of which 10,689,598 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 630,572 bushels at New York, 1,977,000 bushels at Erie and 3,579,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 8,338,971 bushels on the same date last year of which 4,733,596 bushels were located at Buffalo, 1,318,055 bushels at New York and 2,218,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,723,728 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,988,894 bushels compared with 3,980,213 bushels for the previous week and 3,839,390 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 19, 1934 amounted to 12,960,738 bushels a decrease of 2,479,529 bushels from previous week when 15,440,267 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 10,420,017 bushels. For the twelve weeks ending October 19, 1934 and October 20, 1933, 122,604,579 and 118,335,982 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 4,268,597 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 19, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending October 20, 1933: Manitoba 915,611 (593,224) bushels, Saskatchewan 5,749,579 (5,281,545) bushels, Alberta 6,295,548 (4,545,248) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to October 19, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 23,837,777 (20,024,498), Saskatchewan 57,838,985 (59,235,523), Alberta 40,927,817 (39,075,961) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 26, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,411,219 bushels compared with 2,675,705 bushels for the previous week an increase of 735,514 bushels.

Montreal wheat clearances are little over one-half of those for same period in the previous year. Quebec shows a reduction of 2.7 million and Sorel 1.5 million bushels, while United States Atlantic Ports increased 3.3 million, Churchill 1.3 million and Vancouver 2 million bushels. The net reduction from all ports amounted to 7.5 million bushels.

International Trade

World shipments for the week ending October 29, 1934 amounted to 9,134,000 bushels compared with shipments of 9,088,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,568,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and the Argentine showed decreases of 371,000 and 1,236,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while an increase was noted in Australian shipments of 1,021,000 bushels.

During the first thirteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 137 million bushels compared with 132 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 48 million bushels of wheat compared with 29 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.5 million bushels per week during the first thirteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.0 and 10.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 4.0 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.5 million bushels per week during the first thirteen weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.7 million bushels per week as compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 26, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 26, 1934 show a net increase of 5,023,689 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store are as follows:- wheat 249,639,350, oats 14,696,962, barley 14,722,904, flaxseed 596,998 and rye 4,035,599 bushels a total of 283,691,813 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 4,105,379, oats 602,936, barley 227,394 and rye 94,509 bushels while flaxseed shows a decrease of 6,529 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 249,007,817, oats 19,044,244, barley 12,012,574 flaxseed 928,643 and rye 5,037,053 bushels, a total of 286,030,331 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks this week shows a total increase of 1,529,532 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 1,387,710, oats 130,557, barley 1,267, flaxseed 1,795 and rye 8,203 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a total increase of 404,599 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 290,886, oats 42,330 and barley 71,383 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 789,673 Bu. Wheat increased 791,534 bushels while oats and barley show decreases of 1,273 and 588 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Grain stocks remain the same as previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR:- Wheat stocks show an increase of 373,935 bushels.

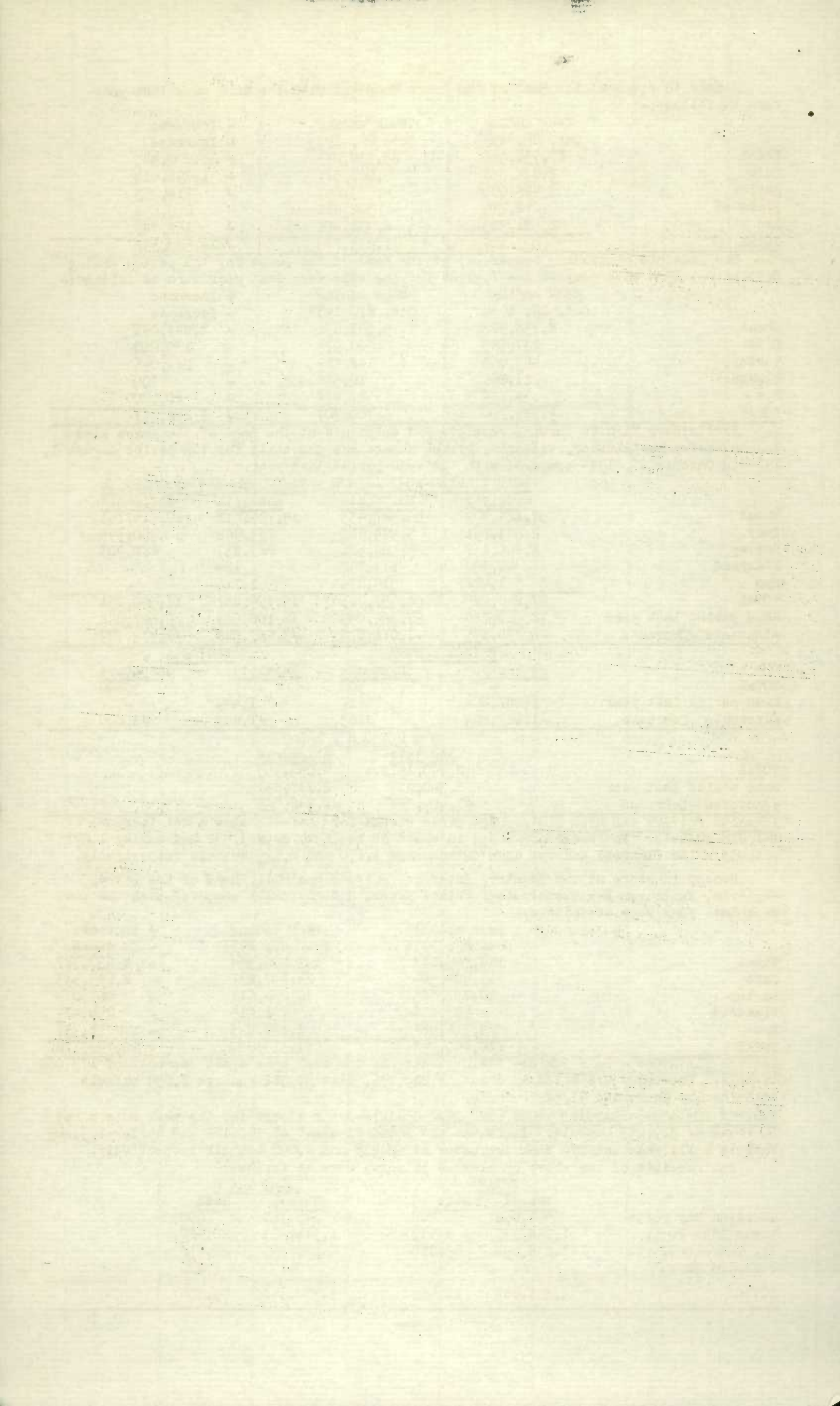

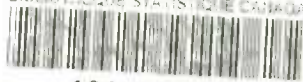
