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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 2, 1934 shows an increase of 4,928,959 bushels as compared with the previous week, and 2,748,367 bushels for the same week in 1933. The visible supply was reported as 254,544,283 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 249,615,324 bushels for the previous week and 251,795,916 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,501,330 bushels of which 11,028,038 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 440,640 bushels at New York, 1,977,000 bushels at Erie and 3,579,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 9,722,684 bushels on the same date last year of which 5,762,015 bushels were located at Buffalo, 1,493,158 bushels at New York and 2,288,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,656,046 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 4,398,422 bushels compared with 3,988,894 bushels for the previous week and 4,673,905 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 26, 1934 amounted to 9,749,046 bushels, a decrease of 3,211,692 bushels from the previous week when 12,960,738 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 5,323,567 bushels. For the thirteen weeks ending October 26, 1934 and October 27, 1933, 132,353,625 and 123,659,549 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 8,694,076 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 26, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending October 27, 1933: Manitoba 551,674 (526,230); Saskatchewan 4,084,901 (2,839,489); Alberta 5,112,471 (1,957,848) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to October 26, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows; figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 24,389,451 (20,550,728); Saskatchewan 61,923,886 (62,075,012); Alberta 46,040,288 (41,033,809) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 2, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,944,151 bushels as compared with 3,411,219 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 467,068 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 5, 1934 amounted to 10,169,000 bushels compared with shipments of 9,134,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,480,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments decreased 548,000 bushels while shipments from the Argentine and Australia showed increases of 405,000 and 954,000 bushels respectively.

During the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 147 million bushels compared with 142 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 50 million bushels of wheat compared with 31 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first fourteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.5 million bushels per week during the first fourteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 and 10.6 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 4.0 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.7 million bushels per week during the first fourteen weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 2, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 2, 1934 show a net increase of 5,601,547 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 254,544,283, oats 16,041,080, barley 14,542,584, flaxseed 626,680 and rye 4,041,654 a total of 289,796,281 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 4,928,959, oats 846,372, flaxseed 27,126 and rye 1,001 bushels while barley decreased 201,911 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 251,795,916, oats 19,327,598, barley 11,940,021, flaxseed 904,185 and rye 4,543,631 bushels, a total of 288,511,351 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks this week show a net increase of 1,259,871 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 813,677, oats 448,217, flaxseed 1,262 and rye 1,707 bushels while barley decreased 4,992 bushels.
