WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 9, 1934 shows an increase of 1,201,640 bushels as compared with the previous week, and 5,041,291 bushels for the same week in 1933. The visible supply was reported as 255,101,773 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 253,900,133 bushels for the previous week and 250,060,482 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,242,903 bushels of which 12,123,754 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 966,257 bushels at New York, 1,977,000 bushels at Erie and 3,579,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 10,562,536 bushels on the same date last year of which 6,325,084 bushels were located at Buffalo, 1,745,819 bushels at New York and 2,288,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,656,046 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,738,987 bushels compared with 4,398,422 bushels for the previous week and 2,875,518 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 2, 1934 amounted to 8,073,798 bushels, a slight decrease of 1,675,248 bushels from the previous week when 9,749,046 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week as year ago the receipts were 7,742,939 bushels. For the fourteen weeks ending November 2, 1934 and November 3, 1933, 140,427,423 and 131,402,488 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 9,024,935 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 2, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending November 3, 1933: Manitoba 418,515 (464,003); Saskatchewan 3,336,156 (4,183,954); Alberta 4,319,127 (2,921,960) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to November 2, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows; figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 24,807,966 (21,187,753); Saskatchewan 65,260,042 (66,258,966); Alberta 50,359,415 (43,955,769) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 9, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,000,545 bushels as compared with 2,944,151 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 56,394 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 9, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 9, 1934 show a net increase of 252,569 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 255,101,773, oats 15,070,333, barley 14,155,002, flaxseed 635,777 and rye 4,069,225 bushels a total of **289,032,110 bushels**. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,201,640, flaxseed 7,323 and rye 37,880 bushels while decreases are noted in oats of 530,273 and barley 464,001 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 250,060,482, oats 19,926,904, barley 11,928,815, flaxseed 846,817 and rye 4,194,411 bushels, a total of 286,957,429 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store this week show a decrease of 370,846 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 209,338, oats 143,782, barley 10,813, flaxseed 1,422 and rye 5,491 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC:- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 19,697 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 28,489 and barley 9,548 bushels while wheat decreased 18,340 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 54,771 bushels. Oats decreased 123,736 bushels while increases are noted in wheat of 41,281, barley 27,632 and flaxseed 52 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR:- Wheat in store shows a decrease of 333 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,217,334 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,006,155 and oats 278,559 bushels while increases are shown in barley of 20,696, flaxseed 7,480 and rye 39,204 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:- Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 571,897 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat and barley of 659,435 and 377,679 bushels respectively while oats increased 465,217 bushels.
