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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 23, 1934 shows an increase of 1,800,404 bushels as compared with the previous week and 11,440,502 bushels with the same week in 1933. The visible supply was reported as 257,708,319 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 255,907,915 for the previous week and 246,267,817 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,601,594 bushels of which 13,238,593 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,529,855 bushels at New York, 2,205,000 bushels at Erie and 3,858,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y.. This compared with 11,872,671 bushels on the same date last year of which 7,311,387 bushels were located at Buffalo, 1,842,942 bushels at New York and 2,269,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,450,645 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,313,351 bushels compared with 2,431,911 bushels for the previous week and 3,547,163 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 16, 1934 amounted to 6,219,496 bushels, a decrease of 733,359 bushels from the previous week when 6,952,855 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 6,454,158 bushels. For the sixteen weeks ending November 16, 1934 and November 17, 1933, 153,599,774 and 144,529,045 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 9,070,729 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 16, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending November 17, 1933: Manitoba 240,829 (357,654); Saskatchewan 2,623,752 (3,397,285); Alberta 3,354,915 (2,699,219) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to November 16, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 25,341,892 (22,009,410); Saskatchewan 70,478,233 (72,823,771); Alberta 57,779,649 (49,695,864) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 23, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,923,429 bushels as compared with 2,045,534 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 877,895 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 26, 1934 amounted to 10,111,000 bushels compared with shipments of 10,384,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,664,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Argentine shipments decreased slightly during the past week while shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 362,000 and 1,046,000 bushels respectively.

During the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 180 million bushels compared with 171 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 62 million bushels of wheat compared with 33 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.6 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 and 11.0 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.9 million bushels per week compared with 4.7 and 7.0 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.7 million bushels per week as compared with 1.9 million bushels during the same period last year.





CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 23, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 23, 1934 show a net increase of 1,557,011 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 257,708,319, oats 15,579,116, barley 12,968,932, flaxseed 604,075 and rye 4,021,160 bushels, a total of 290,881,602 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,800,404, oats 176,901, flaxseed 6,362 and rye 30,533 while barley decreased 457,189 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 246,267,817, oats 20,338,546, barley 12,099,442, flaxseed 731,907 and rye 4,193,361 bushels, a total of 283,631,073 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks this week show a decrease of 850,298 bushels, made up as follows: wheat 575,502, oats 168,709, barley 97,655, flaxseed 2,358 and rye 6,074 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 26,571 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 51,594 and barley 22,502 bushels while wheat decreased 47,525 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 894,012 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 523,057, oats 330,769 and barley 40,186 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store shows an increase of 260,005 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store shows an increase of 1,137 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks of grain this week show a net decrease of 744,616 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 641,846, barley 222,287 and flaxseed 50,765 bushels while oats and rye increased 125,136 and 45,146 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 704,404 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 881,440 and rye 60,000 bushels while oats and barley decreased 109,428 and 127,608 bushels respectively.
