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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 30, 1934 shows a decrease of 2,679,756 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 11,685,021 bushels when compared with the same week in 1933. The visible supply was reported as 254,720,320 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 257,400,076 for the previous week and 243,035,299 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.(a)

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,568,341 bushels of which 13,962,458 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,825,115 bushels at New York, 2,205,000 bushels at Erie, 3,858,000 bushels at Albany and 1,657,768 bushels at Duluth. This compared with 14,473,825 bushels on the same date last year of which 8,481,567 bushels were located at Buffalo, 3,055,963 bushels at New York and 2,249,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,250,645 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 4,002,385 bushels compared with 3,313,351 bushels for the previous week and 2,431,911 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 23, 1934 amounted to 4,205,935 bushels, a decrease of 2,013,561 bushels from the previous week when 6,219,496 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,900,513 bushels. For the seventeen weeks ending November 23, 1934 and November 24, 1933, 157,805,709 and 147,429,558 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 10,376,151 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 23, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending November 24, 1933: Manitoba 407,009 (158,006); Saskatchewan 1,610,652 (1,542,141); Alberta 2,188,274 (1,200,366) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to November 23, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 25,748,901 (22,167,416); Saskatchewan 72,088,885 (74,365,912); Alberta 59,967,923 (50,896,230) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 30, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,240,532 bushels as compared with 2,923,429 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 317,103 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending December 3, 1934 amounted to 10,134,000 bushels compared with shipments of 10,111,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,776,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed an increase of 795,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Australian shipments decreased by 761,000 and 515,000 bushels respectively.

During the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 190 million bushels compared with 182 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 65 million bushels of wheat compared with 34 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.6 million bushels per week during the first eighteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 and 11.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.9 million bushels per week compared with 4.8 and 7.3 million bushels per week during the first eighteen weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 1.9 million bushels during the same period last year.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 30, 1934

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 30, 1934 show a net decrease of 2,977,065 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 254,720,320, oats 15,809,545, barley 12,501,261, flaxseed 575,290 and rye 3,969,616 bushels, a total of 287,576,732 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,679,756, barley 429,314, flaxseed 30,735 and rye 46,675 bushels, while oats increased 209,415 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 243,035,299, oats 20,192,070, barley 11,868,677, flaxseed 599,251 and rye 4,162,673 bushels, a total of 279,957,375 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Grain in store this week shows a decrease of 635,561 bushels, made up as follows: wheat 509,142, oats 109,264, barley 11,315, flaxseed 3,966 and rye 1,374 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 53,262 bushels. Wheat stocks decreased 171,497 bushels, while increases are noted in oats and barley of 100,874 and 12,361 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER AND NEW WESTMINSTER - Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 440,042 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 263,500, oats 137,855, barley 33,996 and rye 391 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR - Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR - Wheat stocks show an increase of 110,800 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR - Wheat stocks show an increase of 1 bushel.


