WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 7, 1934 shows a slight increase of 130,792 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 11,160,585 bushels when compared with the same week in 1933. The visible supply was reported as 254,610,120 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 254,479,328 bushels for the previous week and 243,449,535 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,403,160 bushels of which 15,682,030 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 2,503,998 bushels at New York, 2,500,000 bushels at Erie, 4,011,000 bushels at Albany, and 1,647,032 bushels at Duluth. This compared with 16,154,609 bushels on the same date last year of which 8,195,099 bushels were located at Buffalo, 4,945,302 bushels at New York and 2,000,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,248,845 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 1,715,506 bushels compared with 4,002,385 bushels for the previous week. Navigation being closed no reports of wheat in transit were reported for 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 30, 1934 amounted to 3,725,633 bushels, a decrease of 430,302 bushels from the previous week when 4,205,935 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 3,955,611 bushels. For the eighteen weeks ending November 30, 1934 and December 1, 1933, 161,531,342 and 151,385,169 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows an increase of 10,146,173 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 30, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending December 1, 1933: Manitoba 314,670 (277,876); Saskatchewan 1,178,499 (2,163,303); Alberta 2,232,464 (1,514,427) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to November 30, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 26,063,571 (22,445,292); Saskatchewan 73,267,384 (76,529,220); Alberta 62,200,387 (52,410,657) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 7, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,997,915 bushels as compared with 3,240,532 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,328,873 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending December 10, 1934 amounted to 8,322,000 bushels compared with shipments of 10,134,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,648,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed a sharp decrease of 1,946,000 bushels as compared with the previous week. Argentine shipments increased by 523,000 bushels during the past week while Australian shipments showed a decrease of 493,000 bushels.


During the first nineteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 198 million bushels compared with 191 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 69 million bushels of wheat compared with 35 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first nineteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.4 million bushels per week during the first nineteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.0 and 11.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.8 million bushels per week compared with 4.7 and 7.3 million bushels per week during the first nineteen weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 1.8 million bushels during the same period last year.

DULUTH:- Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by rail for the week ending December 8, 1934, were nil. For the period from August 1, 1934 to date rail receipts amounted to wheat 110,620, oats 194,873 and rye 3,179 bushels.

Receipts by water for the week ending December 8, 1934 amounted to wheat 347,486, oats 165,844 and barley 221,670 bushels. Receipts by water from August 1, 1934 to date amounted to wheat 6,306,019, oats 858,257, barley 1,633,847 and rye 49,906 bushels.

Rail shipments for the week ending December 8, 1934 amounted to oats 165,844 and barley 160,781 bushels duty paid. Rail shipments from August 1, 1934 to date amounted to wheat 1,230,161, oats 322,276 and barley 917,820 bushels.

Lake shipments from August 1, 1934 to date amounted to wheat 49,562 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 7, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 7, 1934 show a net decrease of 568,297 bushels as compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 254,610,120, oats 16,018,332, barley 11,721,609, flaxseed 560,434 and rye 3,978,480 bushels a total of 286,889,475 bushels. Decreases were noted in barley of 779,979 and flaxseed 16,095 bushels while increases are shown in wheat of 130,792, oats 85,809 and rye 11,176 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 243,449,535, oats 20,049,178, barley 11,860,992, flaxseed 617,565 and rye 4,122,054 bushels, a total of 280,099,324 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net increase of 11,253 bushels. Oats increased 70,743 bushels while decreases are shown in wheat of 55,954, barley 782, flaxseed 1,533 and rye 1,216 bushels.


