WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 9, 1934, shows a decrease of 347,534 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 187,092,725 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 187,440,259 bushels for the previous week and 193,463,164 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,587,782 bushels of which 4,391,177 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,467,852 bushels at New York, 1,615,000 bushels at Erie and 1,867,000 bushels at Albany, N. Y. This compared with 5,700,111 bushels on the same date last year of which 2,693,723 bushels were located at Buffalo, 854,221 bushels at New York and 1,994,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with 3,711,190 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 4,098,415 bushels compared with 3,476,796 bushels for the previous week and 3,460,335 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

Primary Movement

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 3, 1934, amounted to 1,502,700 bushels, a decrease of 950,360 bushels from the previous week when 2,453,139 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were only 394,491 bushels. As this is the first week of the crop year 1934-35, no accumulative figure can be shown.

Marketings by provinces during the above week were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week of August 4, 1933: Manitoba 142,412 (60,245) bushels, Saskatchewan 546,650 (85,408) bushels, Alberta 813,708 (243,838) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending August 9, 1934, the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,754,148 bushels compared with 2,485,981 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 266,167 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 10, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 10, 1934 show net decrease of 525,531 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 187,092,725, oats 10,657,870, barley 8,576,966, flaxseed 453,015 and rye 3,779,892 bushels a total of 210,580,468 bushels. Decreases were made up as follows:- wheat 256,984, barley 453,987, and rye 79,073 bushels, while increases are shown in oats of 261,778 bushels and flaxseed 2,735 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 193,463,164, oats 12,504,969, barley 8,004,289, flaxseed 1,084,580 and rye 5,712,638 a total of 220,859,640 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Grain in store shows net decrease of 40,371 bushels. Wheat and barley decreasing 208,105 and 1,952 bushels respectively. Decreases are noted in oats of 127,798, barley 12,524 and rye 29,364 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show net increase of 41,377 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 40,857 and barley 1,386, while oats decreased 866 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show net increase of 69,905 bushels. Wheat and oats increased 41,512 and 32,565 bushels respectively while barley decreased 4,112 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks remained the same as the previous week, namely 1,091,087 bushels of wheat and 303 bushels of oats.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks are the same as the previous week amounting to 928,074 bushels. Other grains nil.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR. - Wheat is the only grain in store and amounts to 2,475,764 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES. - Grain in Transit show a net increase of 308,584 bushels. Wheat and oats increased 350,864 and 64,818 bushels respectively, while barley increased 107,098 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - A net decrease is noted in the grain stocks of 2,958,350 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat 2,167,437 bushels oats 181,659 bushels barley 505,026 bushels and rye 107,576 bushels while flaxseed increased 2,843 bushels.





WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 3, 1934 shows a decrease of 2,039,332 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 187,340,709 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 185,410,377 bushels for the previous week and 195,944,810 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,727,315 bushels of which 5,747,869 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,494,542 bushels at New York, 1,615,000 bushels at Erie and 844,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compares with 6,415,527 bushels on the same date last year of which 3,237,252 bushels were located at Buffalo, 1,001,835 bushels at New York and 1,994,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with 3,729,252 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on lakes amounted to 3,747,551 bushels compared with 3,476,796 bushels for the previous week and 2,736,275 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT.

^{in/} Wheat marketing^s the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 27 amounted to 2,937,313 bushels a decrease of 686,749 bushels from the previous week when 2,885,803 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,621,926 bushels. For the fifty-two weeks ending July 27, 1934 and July 31, 1933, 226,809,811 and 370,611,784 bushels respectively were received from the farms. The former figure does not include the platform loadings for the week ending July 31, as they were not available at the time of going to press. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 27, 1934 were as follows figures within brackets being those for the week of July 31, 1933: Manitoba 46,984 (-) bushels; Saskatchewan 1,090,134 (1,553,856) bushels; Alberta 1,113,446 (658,165) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to July 27, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1932-33 were as follows: figures within brackets being those for 1932-33: Manitoba 28,299,752 (37,730,650) bushels; Saskatchewan 111,704,143 (187,878,663) bushels; Alberta 86,804,916 (145,002,471) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES.

During the week ending August 3, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,217,450 bushels compared with 2,888,118 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 670,568 bushels.
