WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 28, 1934 shows a slight decrease of 142,727 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 16,098,166 bushels when compared with the same week in 1933. The visible supply was reported as 257,785,547 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 257,928,274 bushels for the previous week and 241,687,381 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,561,749 bushels of which 15,812,846 bushels were in store at Buffalo 2,136,540 bushels at New York, 2,495,000 bushels at Erie, 4,139,000 bushels at Albany, 1,849,363 bushels at Duluth and 786,000 bushels at Chicago. This compared with 14,038,595 bushels on the same date last year of which 5,482,648 bushels were located at Buffalo, 5,870,958 bushels at New York and 1,092,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,248,845 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 21, 1934 amounted to 2,501,578 bushels, a decrease of 2,609,005 bushels from the previous week when 5,110,583 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,832,253 bushels. For the twenty-one weeks ending December 21, 1934 and December 22, 1933, 172,127,383 and 159,563,020 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This is an increase of 12,564,363 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 21, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending December 22, 1933: Manitoba 75,218 (24,617); Saskatchewan 800,810 (768,668); Alberta 1,625,550 (1,038,968) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to December 21, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 26,555,807 (22,801,148); Saskatchewan 76,649,250 (80,344,733); Alberta 68,922,326 (56,417,139) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 28, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 805,553 bushels as compared with 1,441,728 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 636,175 bushels, and a decrease of 1,185,050 bushels compared with the same week in 1933.

World shipments for the week ending December 31, 1934 amounted to 5,119,000 bushels compared with shipments of 7,500,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,424,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments decreased slightly during the past week. Shipments from the Argentine and Australia showed decreases of 988,000 and 1,189,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week.

During the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 219 million bushels compared with 220 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 74 million bushels of wheat compared with 39 million bushels for the same period in 1933.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-two weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.0 and 11.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week compared with 4.6 and 7.0 million bushels per week during the first twenty-two weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.4 million bushels per week as compared with 1.8 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 28, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 28, 1934 show a net increase of 485,018 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 257,785,547, oats 16,711,796, barley 13,238,622, flaxseed 444,898 and rye 4,292,248 bushels, a total of 292,473,111 bushels. Increases were noted in oats of 124,412, barley 179,007, flaxseed 340 and rye 323,986 bushels while wheat decreased 142,727 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 241,687,381, oats 20,144,460, barley 11,605,457, flaxseed 603,003 and rye 4,109,614 bushels, a total of 278,149,915 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Preliminary figures of stocks of grain at Country Elevators have not been received therefore figures of December 21, 1934 were used.
