WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 4, 1935 shows a slight decrease of 344,549 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 17,931,179 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 257,748,543 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 258,093,092 bushels for the previous week and 239,817,364 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,136,698 bushels of which 15,643,035 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,991,289 bushels at New York, 2,495,000 bushels at Erie, 4,139,000 bushels at Albany, 1,739,374 bushels at Duluth and 786,000 bushels at Chicago. This compared with 13,144,240 bushels on the same date last year of which 4,955,255 bushels were located at Buffalo, 5,639,988 bushels at New York and 888,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,248,845 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 28, 1934 amounted to 1,658,000 bushels, a decrease of 843,178 bushels from the previous week when 2,501,578 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,250,584 bushels. For the twenty-two weeks ending December 28, 1934 and December 29, 1933, 173,785,383 and 160,813,604 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This is an increase of 12,971,779 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending December 28, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending December 29, 1933: Manitoba 131,728 (58,194); Saskatchewan 700,937 (667,985); Alberta 825,335 (524,405) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to December 28, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933: Manitoba 26,687,535 (22,859,342); Saskatchewan 77,350,187 (81,012,718); Alberta 69,747,661 (56,941,544) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 4, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,174,848 bushels as compared with 805,553 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 369,295 bushels, and a decrease of 1,110,490 bushels compared with the same week in 1934.



World shipments for the week ending January 7, 1935 amounted to 7,455,000 bushels compared with shipments of 6,822,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,605,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease of 827,000 bushels during the past week, while Argentine and Australian shipments increased 1,425,000 and 259,000 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week.


During the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 229 million bushels compared with 227 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 77 million bushels of wheat compared with 40 million bushels for the same period in 1934.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-three weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-three weeks of the crop year as compared with 9.9 and 11.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.5 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-three weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.4 million bushels per week as compared with 1.7 million bushels during the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 4, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 4, 1935 show a net decrease of 266,025 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 257,748,543; Oats 16,849,954; Barley 13,135,499; Flaxseed 441,480 and Rye 3,932,391 bushels, a total of 292,108,367 bushels. Decreases were noted in Wheat of 344,549, Barley 47,598 and Rye 28,519 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats and Flaxseed of 144,976 and 9,665 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 239,817,364: Oats 19,962,183; Barley 11,371,380; Flaxseed 601,935 and Rye 4,086,477 bushels, a total 275,839,339 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Stocks of grain this week show a net increase of 79,785 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 42,400; Oats 34,374; Barley 1,386 and Rye 3,041 bushels, while Flaxseed decreased 1,416 bushels.


INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS: - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 95,753 bushels. Wheat decreased 101,339 bushels, while Oats and Barley increased 1,395 and 2,191 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS: - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 128,575 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 51,412 and Oats 105,825 bushels, while Barley decreased 28,662 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS: - Wheat stocks decreased 301,280 bushels.

VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR): Stocks of grain show a net increase of 925,825 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 557,141, Oats 72,027, Flaxseed 1,865 and Rye 6,692 bushels, while Barley decreased 5,900 bushels.
