WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 18, 1935 shows a decrease of 2,762,500 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 18,768,723 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 253,949,733 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 256,712,233 bushels for the previous week and 235,181,010 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,164,012 bushels of which 15,066,762 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,799,876 bushels at New York, 2,290,000 bushels at Erie, 4,139,000 bushels at Albany, 1,739,374 bushels at Duluth and 786,000 bushels at Chicago. This compared with 10,802,537 bushels on the same date last year of which 4,035,885 bushels were located at Buffalo, 4,926,655 bushels at New York and 413,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,248,845 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 11, 1935 amounted to 1,070,442 bushels, an increase of 240,352 bushels over the previous week, when 830,090 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,369,521 bushels. For the twenty-four weeks ending January 11, 1935 and January 12, 1934, 175,685,915 and 164,676,422 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This is an increase of 11,009,493 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 11, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending January 12, 1934: Manitoba 56,662 (69,796); Saskatchewan 399,292 (941,248); Alberta 614,488 (1,358,477) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to January 11, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 26,797,491 (23,033,275); Saskatchewan 78,031,325 (82,685,097); Alberta 70,857,099 (58,958,050) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending January 18, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,522,401 bushels as compared with 1,637,394 bushels for the previous week, an decrease of 114,993 bushels, and a decrease of 1,903,813 bushels compared with the same week in 1934.

The first settlement in Boston was made by a party of Englishmen, who arrived in the year 1630, under the command of John Winthrop. World shipments for the week ending January 21, 1935 amounted to 9,411,000 bushels compared with shipments of 9,357,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,672,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the past week North American and Australian shipments showed increases of 447,000 and 997,000 bushels respectively, while shipments from the Argentine decreased 998,000 bushels, as compared with the previous week.

During the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 248 million bushels compared with 251 million bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 85 million bushels of wheat compared with 46 million bushels for the same period in 1934.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-1933.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.9 million bushels per week during the first twenty-five weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.0 and 11.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.4 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.8 million bushels per week during the first twenty-five weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.4 million bushels per week as compared with 1.8 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 18, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 18, 1935 show a net decrease of 3,420,197 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 253,949,733, oats 16,154,514, barley 12,909,932, flaxseed 425,473 and rye 3,885,472 bushels, a total of 287,325,124 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,762,500, oats 638,422 and barley 117,020 while flaxseed and rye increased 1,760 and 95,985 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 235,181,010, oats 19,223,300, barley 11,349,437, flaxseed 603,325 and rye 4,089,942 bushels, a total of 270,447,014 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store this week shows a decrease of 267,000 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 160,565, oats 65,850, barley 34,492, flaxseed 189 and rye 5,904 bushels.

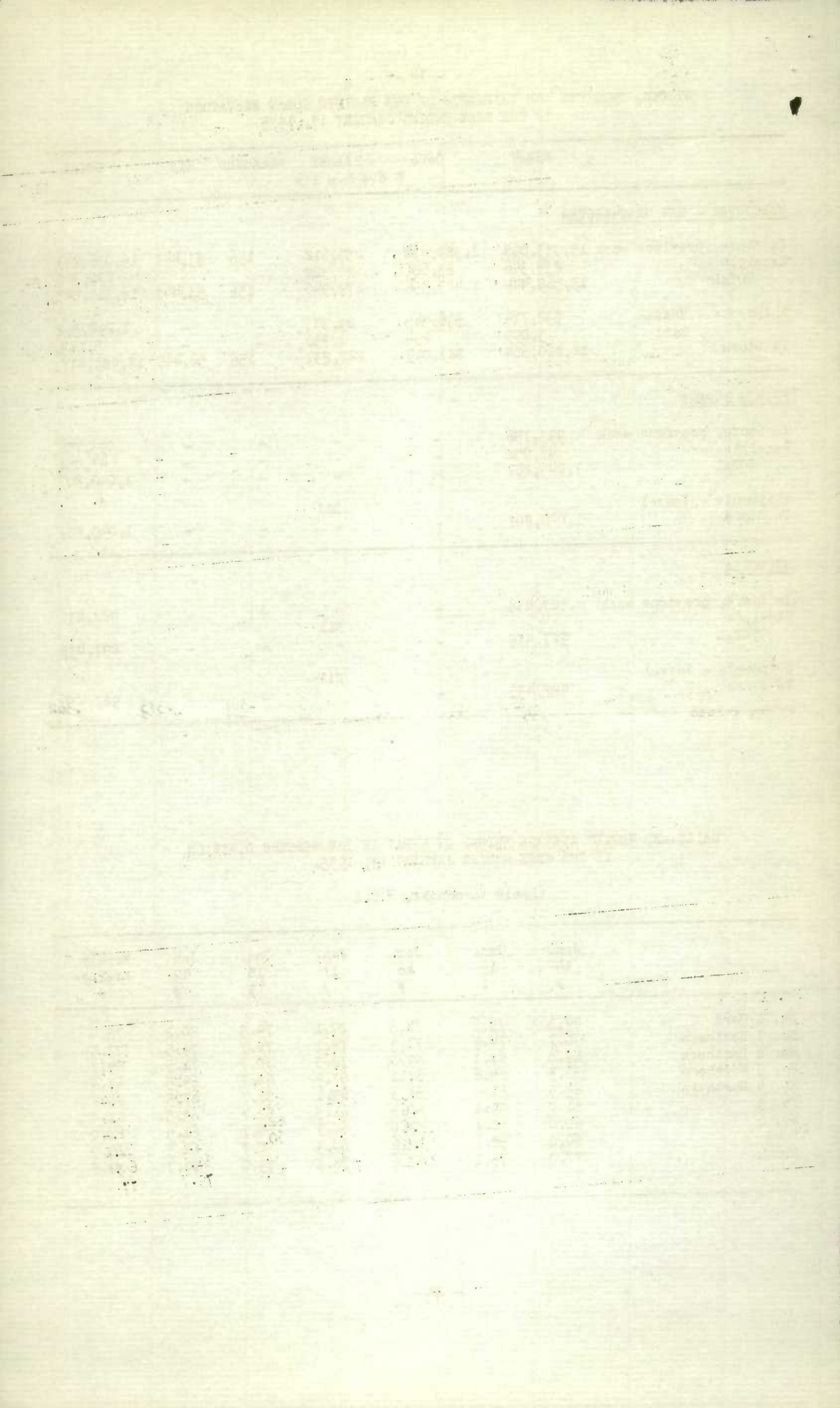
