WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 1, 1935 shows a decrease of 3,964,407 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 12,469,971 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 246,155,306 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 250,119,713 bushels for the previous week and 233.685,335 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,022,210 bushels of which 13,386,311 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,451,525 bushels at New York, 2,202,000 bushels at Erie, 4,139,000 bushels at Albany, 1,714,374 bushels at Duluth and 786,000 bushels at Chicago. This compared with 9,797,603 bushels on the same date last year of which 3,895,811 bushels were located at Buffalo, 4,357,669 bushels at New York and 163,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,248,845 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 25, 1935 amounted to 509,729 bushels, a decrease of 341,272 bushels for the provinces when 851,001 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 2,119,373 bushels. For the twenty-six weeks ending January 25, 1935 170,170,099 bushels and 177,046,645 bushels respectively were received from the farmers. This is an increase of 6,876,546 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending January 25, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending January 26, 1934: Manitoba 45,609 (80,783): Saskatchewan 185,232 (873,686): Alberta 278,888 (1,164,904) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending February 1, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,216,490 bushels as compared with 1,808,143 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 408,347, and a decrease of 864,972 bushels compared with the same week in 1934.



World shipments for the week ending February 4, 1935 amounted to 10,384,000 bushels compared with shipments of 10,323,000, bushels for the previous week and 12,432,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the past week North American and Argentine shipments showed increases of 335,000 and 964,000 bushels respectively while shipments from Australia decreased 830,000 bushels as compared with the previous week.


During the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 270 million bushels compared with 276 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 93 million bushels of wheat compared with 53 million bushels for the same period in 1933-34.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-seven weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-1933.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first twenty-seven weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 and 11.7 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.3 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.7 million bushels per week during the first twenty-seven weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.5 million bushels per week as compared with 2.0 million bushels during the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 1, 1935

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 1, 1935 show a net decrease of 4,015,799 bushels compared with the revised figures of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 246,153,361, oats 15,562,937, barley 12,444,785, flaxseed 409,822 and rye 3,932,634 bushels, a total of 278,503,539 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,966,352, oats 134,432 and flaxseed 5,627 bushels while barley and rye increased 68,036 and 22,576 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 233,685,335, oats 18,752,941, barley 11,044,623, flaxseed 603,836 and rye 4,071,214 bushels, a total of 268,157,949 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a decrease of 459,995, bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 321,566, oats 98,114, barley 32,583, flaxseed 4,5%9 and rye 3,183 bushels.


INTERIOR RUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 107,804 bushels, Wheat and oats show decreases of 103,571 and 4,233 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,378,358 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,292,495 and only 100,112 bushels while barley increased 14,249 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR .- Wheat stocks show an increase of 170,915 bushels.

VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS .- Grain in store remains same as the previous week.
