WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 8, 1935 shows a decrease of 1,534,794 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 11,482,667 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 244,318,030 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 245,852,824 bushels for the previous week and 232,835,363 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,020,554 bushels of which 13,709,713 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,245,467 bushels at New York, 2,143,000 bushels at Erie, 4,139,000 bushels at Albany, 1,714,374 bushels at Duluth and 786,000 bushels at Chicago. This compared with 8,593,159 bushels on the same date last year of which 3,722,001 bushels were located at Buffalo, 3,629,183 bushels at New York and 894,121 bushels at Boston.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels compared with 2,248,845 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 1, 1935 amounted to 1,038,186 bushels, an increase of 528,457 bushels over the previous week when 509,729 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 1,870,053 bushels. For the twenty-seven weeks ending February 1, 1935 and February 2, 1934, 178,084,831 bushels and 172,040,152 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This is an increase of 6,044,679 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 1, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending February 2, 1934: Manitoba 59,122 (114,067); Saskatchewan 385,700 (698,660); Alberta 593,298 (1,057,326) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to February 1, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 26,936,614 (23,337,158); Saskatchewan 78,874,614 (85,604,724); Alberta 72,273,603 (63,038,270) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending February 8, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,101,360 bushels as compared with 2,216,490 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 115,130, and a decrease of 286,911 bushels compared with the same week in 1934.



World shipments for the week ending February 11, 1934 amounted to 11,052,000 bushels compared with shipments of 10,384,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,536,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the past week North American and Australian shipments showed increases of 178,000 and 486,000 bushels respectively while shipments from the Argentine decreased slightly.

During the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 281 million bushels compared with 288 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 98 million bushels of wheat compared with 57 million bushels for the same period in 1933-34.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-eight weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-1933.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first twenty-eight weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.0 and 11.8 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.3 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.7 million bushels per week during the first twenty-eight weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.5 million bushels per week as compared with 2.0 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 8, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 8, 1925 show a net decrease of 1,983,175 bushels when compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 244,318,031, oats 15,149,574, barley 12,255,119, flaxseed 417,643 and rye 3,939,244 bushels a total of 276,079,611 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,534,793, oats 340,098 and barley 123,290 bushels while increases are shown in flaxseed and rye of 3,448 and 11,558 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 232,835,363, oats 18,816,110, barley 10,934,727, flaxseed 602,955 and rye 4,059,915 bushels, a total of 267,249,070 bushels.

Western Country Elevators:- Grain in store this week shows a net decrease of 25,873 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 13,191, barley 49,180, flaxseed 843 and rye 630 bushels while oats increased 37,971 bushels.






