WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending August 17, 1934, shows a decrease of 2,107,930 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 185,123,667 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 187,231,597 bushels for the previous week and 191,534,647 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,386,124 bushels of which 5,047,673 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 2,776,540 bushels at New York, 1,615,000 bushels at Erie and 1,867,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 5,262,942 bushels on the same date last year of which 2,409,812 bushels were located at Buffalo, 855,627 bushels at New York and 1,983,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with 3,700,660 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,691,531 bushels compared with 4,098,415 bushels for the previous week and 3,239,639 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 10, 1934 amounted to 1,509,147 bushels, an increase of 6,447 bushels over the previous week when 1,502,700 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 1,526,250 bushels. For the two weeks ending August 10, 1934 and August 11, 1933, 3,011,917 and 1,920,741 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 10, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending August 11, 1933: Manitoba 134,025 (332,136) bushels; Saskatchewan 387,647 (264,587) bushels; Alberta 987,475 (929,527) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to August 10, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933-34 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933-34: Manitoba 276,437 (392,136) bushels; Saskatchewan 934,297 (349,995) bushels; Alberta, 1,801,183 (1,178,365) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending August 17, 1934, the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,028,872 bushels compared with 2,754,148 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 274,724 bushels.

EXPORTS VIA SHIPPING ROUTES

Wheat Exports - Month of July, 1934.

According to Canadian Customs returns 12,979,231 bushels of wheat valued at \$10,425,535 were exported from Canada during the month of July, 1934. This compared with 16,373,532 bushels valued \$12,302,679 bushels for the same month in 1933. The routing of the exports during July, 1934 shows that 5 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption while 3,863,181 bushels were exported to the United States for export overseas. The balance amounting to 9,116,045 bushels were exported from Canadian seaboard ports 4,810,400 bushels moving from Atlantic ports and 4,305,645 bushels from Pacific ports. Re-routed wheat during the month of July amounted to 843,533 bushels

Wheat Exports - Twelve Months ending July, 1934.

Exports during the twelve months ending July, 1934 amounted to 170,234,013 bushels valued at \$121,010,954 compared with 240,136,568 bushels with value of \$134,221,486 for the same period in 1933. Of the former amount 218,814 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption, 44,679,659 bushels moved out via United States ports, 74,429,895 bushels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports, 48,197,766 bushels via Canadian Pacific ports and 2,707,879 bushels via Port of Churchill, Manitoba, making a total via Canadian ports of 125,335,540 bushels.

The re-routed wheat from United States Lake ports to Canadian ports amounted to 2,314,966 bushels which increases the movement via Canadian ports to 127,650,506 bushels and decreases the exports via United States ports to 44,364,693 bushels.

Wheat flour Exports - Month of July, 1934.

During the month of July, 1934, 22 barrels of wheat flour were exported to the United States direct for consumption, 25,236 barrels moved via United States ports for exports overseas, and 295,935 barrels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports while 86,835 barrels were exported from Canadian Pacific ports. The total export for the month amounted to 408,028 barrels valued at \$1,475,979 compared with 492,765 barrels valued at \$1,733,688 during the same month in 1933.

Wheat flour Exports - Twelve Months ended July, 1934.

Wheat flour exports during the twelve months ending July, 1934 show an increase over the same period in 1933. The number of barrels exported for the twelve month period in 1934 was 5,454,636 barrels valued at \$19,477,652 compared with 5,370,613 barrels valued at \$17,100,260 for the same twelve months in 1933, an increase in quantity of 84,023 barrels in value of \$

Exports via Canadian Atlantic ports amounted to 3,843,582 barrels, via Canadian Pacific Ports 1,164,488 barrels while 442,829 barrels were exported to the United States ports for export overseas and 3,737 barrels were shipped to the United States for consumption.

Wheat and Wheat Flour - Exports combined for the month of July, 1934.

The combined exports of wheat and wheatflour, (the latter reduced to bushels at $4\frac{1}{2}$ to the barrel) amounted to 14,815,357 bushels compared with 18,590,974 bushels for the same month in 1933. Of the former amount 104 bushels went to the United States for consumption, 3,976,743 bushels were exported to the United States for export overseas, 6,142,107 bushels were moved direct from Canadian Atlantic ports and 4,696,403 bushels were shipped overseas from the Canadian Pacific ports, making a total via Canadian ports of 10,838,510 bushels. Re-routed wheat from United States Lake ports during the month of July was reported as 843,533 bushels, which added to the movement via Canadian ports increased same to 11,682,043 bushels. Deduction of same amount from United States ports decreases the quantity to be exported from United States Atlantic ports to 3,133,210 bushels.

Wheat and Wheat flour - Twelve months ending July, 1934.

Exports of wheat and wheat flour in bushels for the twelve months ending July, 1934 and 1933 amounted to 194,779,876 and 264,304,322 bushels respectively. The routing of the first amount was as follows:- 235,633 bushels moved into the United States direct, 46,672,391 bushels were shipped to the United States for export overseas, 91,726,012 bushels were exported direct from Canadian Atlantic ports, 53,437,961 bushels were shipped from Canadian Pacific ports and 2,707,879 bushels moved from Churchill, Manitoba. The re-routed wheat amounted to 2,314,966 bushels which increased the Canadian Atlantic exports to 94,040,978 bushels and decreased the amount routed via United States ports to 44,357,425 bushels.

COARSE GRAIN EXPORTS

Oats exported during the month of July, 1934 amounted to 855,836 bushels compared with 501,382 bushels for the same month in 1933. The former figure includes 16,525 bushels exported direct to the United States for consumption. While the remainder moved through Canadian ports as follows:- Canadian Atlantic ports 426,811 bushels and from Canadian Pacific ports 412,500 bushels. For the twelve months ending July, 1934 6,087,835 bushels were exported compared with 11,075,797 bushels for the crop year 1932-33. The routing of the oat exports during the crop year 1933-34 was 68,092 bushels and 1,765 bushels were exported direct to the United States for consumption and United States ports for export overseas countries respectively. The amount exported from Canadian ports was 6,017,979 bushels 2,681,734 bushels moved via Canadian Atlantic ports and 3,336,245 bushels via Pacific ports.

Barley exports amounted to 493,809 bushels for the month of July, 1934 compared with 330,001 bushels for the corresponding month in 1933. Of the former amount 220,034 bushels moved direct to the United States for consumption while 245,765 and 28,000 were exported direct from Canadian Atlantic and Pacific Ports respectively. For the twelve months ending July 1934, 1,710,651 bushels were exported compared with 5,391,399 bushels for the crop year 1932-33. The former amount includes 223,059 bushels exported direct to the United States for consumption while 752,365 bushels moved via Canadian Atlantic ports and 735,227 bushels via Pacific ports.

There were no rye exports during the month of July, 1934 while 217,143 bushels were exported for the same month in 1933. During the twelve months 2,579,637 bushels were exported, the bulk of which was shipped to the United States, the amount being 2,345,771 bushels, while some 121,877 bushels were shipped to overseas countries via United States ports 111,371 bushels via Atlantic ports and 618 bushels via Pacific ports.

Flaxseed, exported for the month of July amounted to only 2 bushels from Canadian Atlantic ports. The twelve month exports amounted to 187,407 bushels 182,740 bushels going to the United States direct, 4,631 bushels to Atlantic ports and 36 bushels from Pacific ports.

Imports of wheat from Canada into United States for milling in bond for the period from August 5, 1933 to July 28, 1934 amounted to 10,151,000 bushels which added to the 153,304,493 bushels cleared from Canadian and United States seaboard according to Canadian elevators and United States Customs returns makes a total of 163,455,493 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 17, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 17, 1934 show a net decrease of 2,424,669 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: Wheat 185,123,667, oats 10,585,239, barley 8,324,311, flaxseed 455,418 and rye 3,804,015 bushels; a total of 208,292,650 bushels. Decreased are noted in wheat of 2,107,930, oats 40,326 and barley 293,844 bushels while increases are shown in flaxseed and rye of 2,314 and 15,117 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 191,534,647, oats 12,985,983, barley 8,181,097, flaxseed 1,080,932 and rye 5,899,377 bushels, a total of 219,682,036 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain this week show a net increase of 811,680 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 678,691, oats 87,825 and barley 46,242 bushels while flaxseed and rye decreased 534 and 544 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show net increase of 53,302 bushels. An increase is shown in wheat of 56,832 bushels while oats decreased 3,530 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 17,177 bushels. Wheat and barley decreased 76,720 and 8,520 bushels respectively while oats showed an increase of 68,063 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks remained the same as the previous week namely 1,091,087 bushels of wheat and 303 bushels of oats.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR. - Wheat is the only grain in store and showed a decrease of 688,067.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks showed a decrease of 333 bushels. No other grain in store.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - A net decrease is noted in the grain stocks of 3,643,065 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 2,779,686, oats 72,972, barley 820,220 and increases in flaxseed and rye of 973 and 28,840 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES. - Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 269,212 bushels. Wheat decreased 406,884 bushels while oats and barley increased 86,779 and 50,893 bushels respectively.

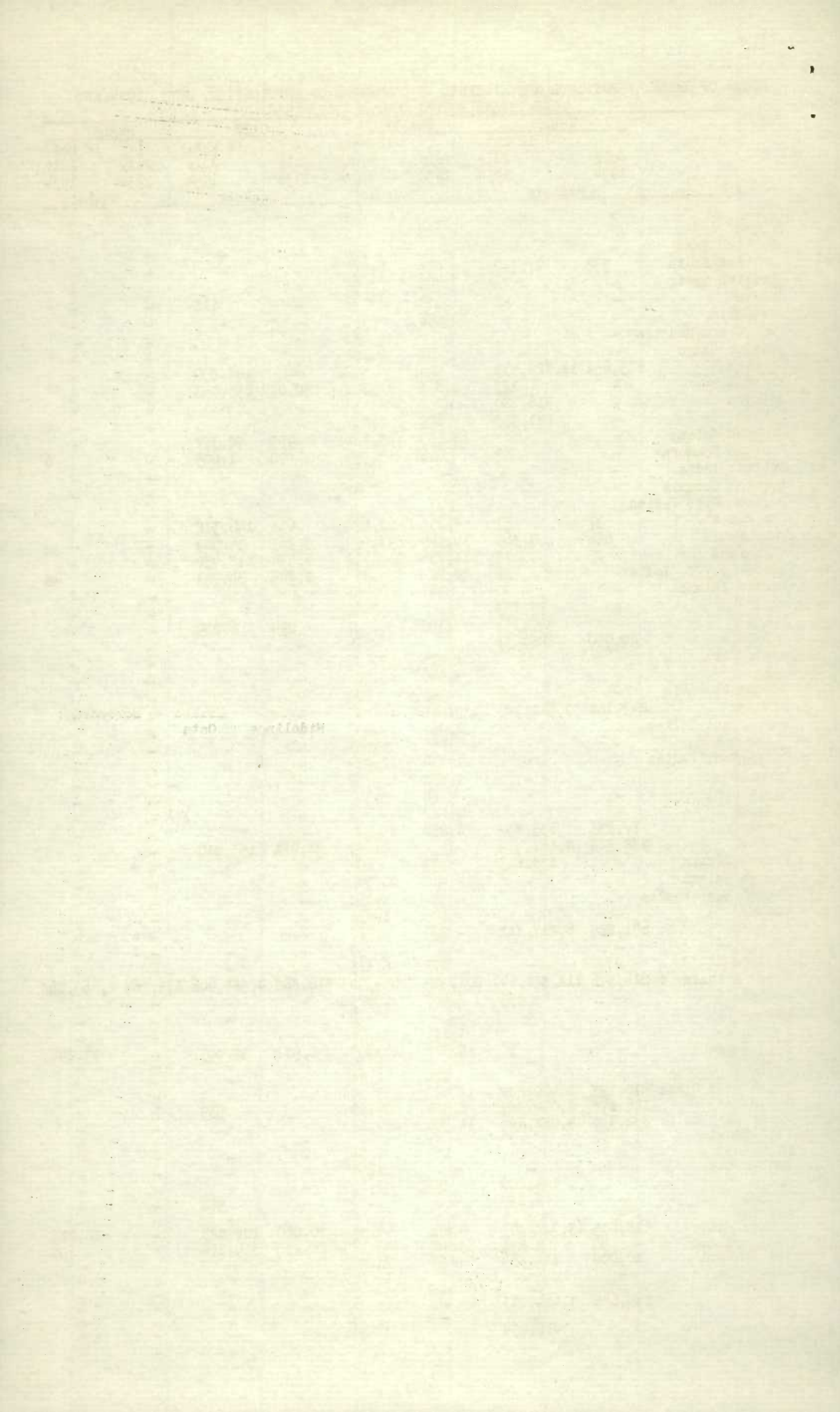
