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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending February 22, 1935 shows a decrease of 3,478,672 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 10,922,546 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 241,051,083 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 244,529,755 bushels for the previous week and 230,128,537 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,901,837 bushels a decrease of 1,523,031 bushels from the previous week when 23,424,868 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports; Buffalo 12,172,322; New York 832,047; Erie 1,998,000; Albany 4,139,000; Duluth 1,644,468; Chicago 786,000; Milwaukee (afloat) 283,000; and New Orleans 47,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the United States port stocks except Chicago, the largest reductions have taken place at Buffalo, New York and New Orleans. For the corresponding week a year ago, the wheat stocks amounted to 7,583,745 bushels, located as follows: Buffalo 3,414,137; New York 2,994,111; Boston 849,121; Philadelphia 211,000; Newport News 111,000 and Duluth 4,376 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels as compared with 2,248,845 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 15, 1935 amounted to 2,305,774 bushels, an increase of 560,678 bushels over the previous week when 1,745,096 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 2,823,624 bushels. For the twenty-nine weeks ending February 15, 1935 and February 16, 1934, 182,135,701 bushels and 176,945,178 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This is an increase of 5,190,523 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 15, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending February 16, 1934: Manitoba 121,722 (138,110); Saskatchewan 819,922 (1,198,733); Alberta 1,364,130 (1,486,781) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to February 15, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 27,150,336 (23,594,229); Saskatchewan 80,388,457 (87,799,136); Alberta 74,596,908 (65,551,813) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending February 22, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,768,741 bushels as compared with 1,207,504 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,561,237, and an increase of 147,868 bushels compared with the same week in 1934. It will be noted that Halifax shipped 771,876 bushels during the week ending February 22, which is the largest shipments on record in the past six years.

World shipments for the week ending February 25, 1935 amounted to 10,821,000 bushels compared with shipments of 10,103,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,736,000 for the corresponding week last year. During the past week North American and Australian shipments showed increases of 768,000 and 159,000 bushels respectively, while shipments from the Argentine decreased 433,000 bushels.

During the first thirty weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 303 million bushels compared with 310 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 107 million bushels of wheat compared with 66 million bushels for the same period in 1933-34.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first thirty weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.3 and 12.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.3 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.4 million bushels per week during the first thirty weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.3 million bushels per week as compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period last year.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 22, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 22, 1935 show a net decrease of 3,729,009 bushels compared with the revised figures of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 241,051,083, oats 15,335,434, barley 11,767,215, flaxseed 413,367 and rye 3,894,203 bushels, a total of 272,461,302 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,478,672, barley 415,142 and rye 13,799 bushels, while oats and flaxseed increased 173,469 and 5,135 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 230,128,537, oats 18,863,082, barley 10,961,823, flaxseed 592,602 and rye 4,050,822 bushels, a total of 264,596,866 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net increase of 144,326 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 170,036 and flaxseed 3,226 bushels while decreases are shown in wheat of 12,336, barley 12,284 and rye 4,316 bushels.

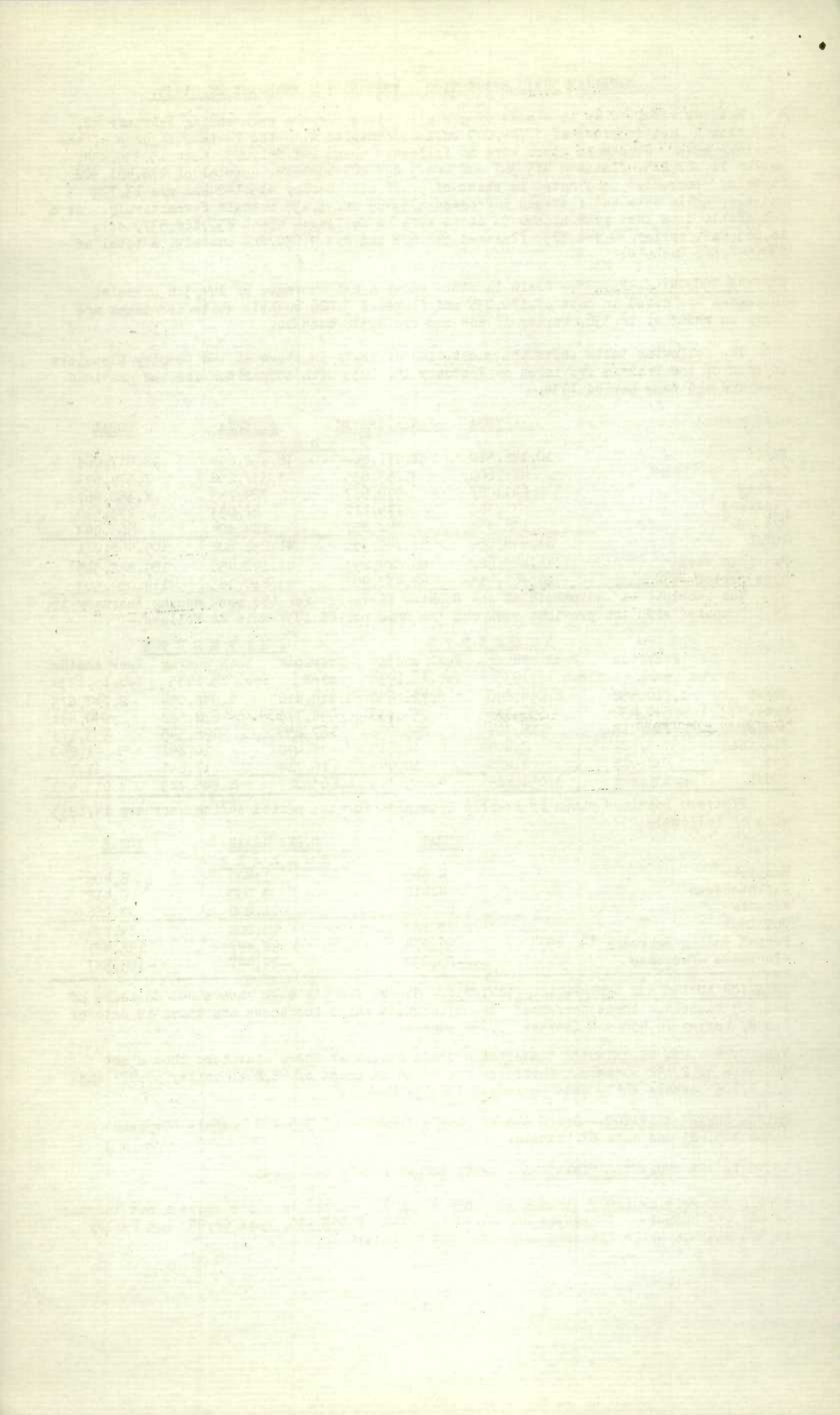
INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 141,205 bushels. Wheat decreased 166,507 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 7,598, barley 16,452 and flaxseed 1,252 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 2,192 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 62,801, barley 50,477 and rye 1,108 bushels while oats increased 112,194 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 385,770 bushels composed of wheat 385,683 and oats 87 bushels.

VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain in store shows a net increase of 499,953 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 465,930, oats 18,288 and barley 16,324 bushels while flaxseed decreased 589 bushels.

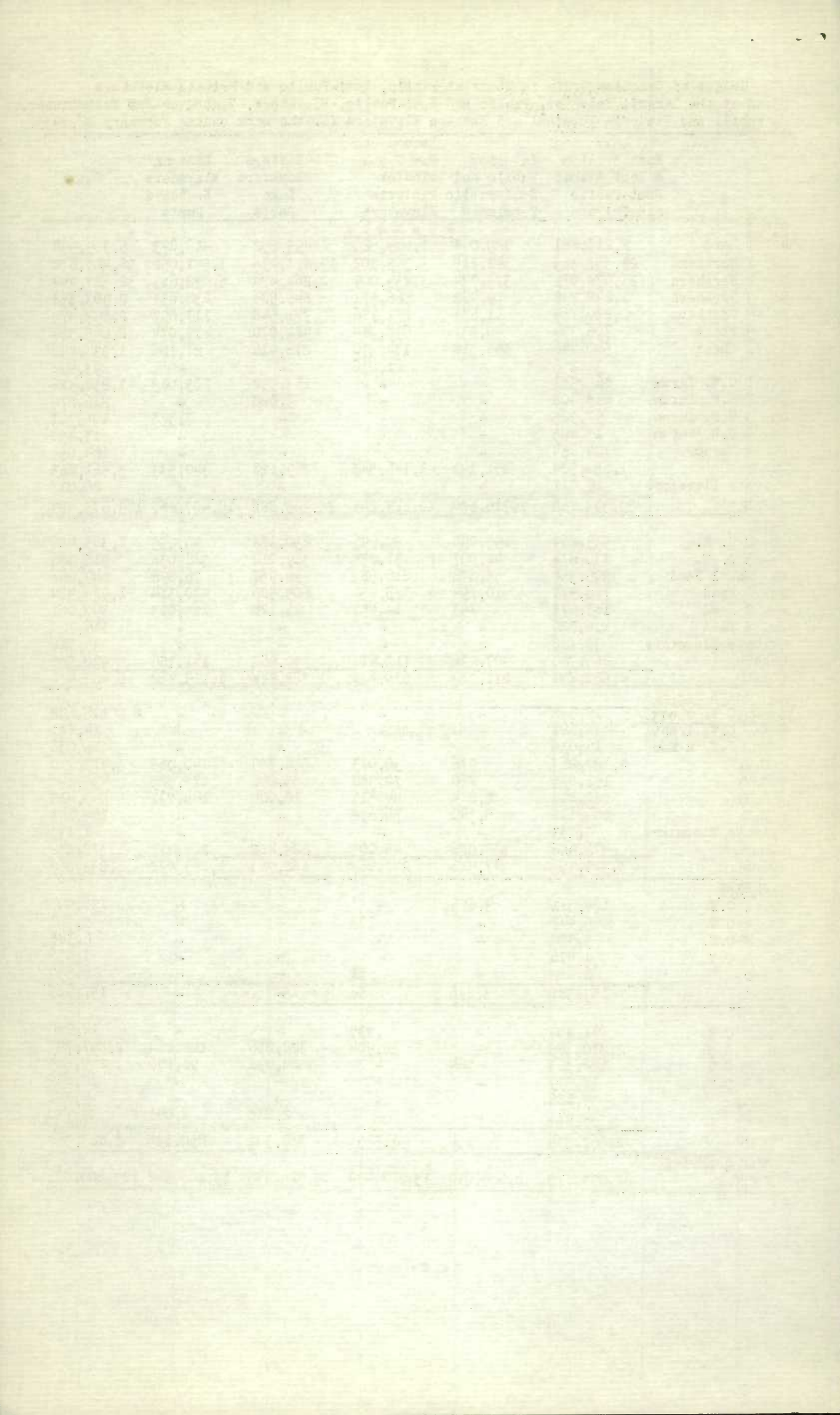
