WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 1, 1935 shows a decrease of 347,354 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 11,379,564 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 240,704,370 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 241,051,724 bushels for the previous week and 229,324,806 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,484,466 bushels a decrease of 417,371 bushels from the previous week when 21,901,837 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports:- Buffalo 11,959,291; New York 704,707; Erie 1,835,000; Albany 4,139,000; Duluth 1,629,468; Chicago 786,000; Milwaukee (afloat) 188,000; and New Orleans 243,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the United States port stocks except Chicago, Albany and New Orleans, the latter showing an increase of 196,000 bushels over the previous week. The largest reductions having taken place at Buffalo, New York and Erie. For the corresponding week a year ago, the wheat stocks amounted to 8,800,744 bushels located as follows:- Buffalo 3,202,972; New York 2,207,159; Albany 2,419,000; Boston 635,226; Philadelphia 221,000; Newport News 111,000; and Duluth 4,387 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels as compared with 2,235,096 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending February 22, 1935 amounted to 2,584,429 bushels, and increase of 278,655 bushels over the previous week when 2,305,774 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 1,706,540 bushels. For the thirty weeks ending February 22, 1935 and February 23, 1934, 184,720,130 bushels and 178,651,718 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This is an increase of 6,068,412 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending February 22, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending February 23, 1934; Manitoba 161,566 (193,707); Saskatchewan 1,057,578 (687,473); Alberta 1,365,285 (825,360) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to February 22, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 27,311,902 (23,787,936); Saskatchewan 81,446,035 (88,486,609); Alberta 75,962,293 (66,377,173) bushels.


OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending March 1, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,006,700 bushels as compared with 2,768,741 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,762,041, and a decrease of 2,556,983 bushels compared with the same week in 1934.

World shipments for the week ending March 4, 1935 amounted to 10,257,000 bushels compared with 10,821,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,432,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the past week North American shipments decreased 1,259,000 bushels while shipments from the Argentine and Australia showed increases of 867,000 and 252,000 bushels respectively.

During the first thirty-one weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 313 million bushels compared with 319 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 112 million bushels of wheat compared with 68 million bushels for the same period in 1933-34.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-one weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1932-1933.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first thirty-one weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.3 and 12.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.2 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.4 million bushels per week during the first thirty-one weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 1, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 1, 1935 show a net decrease of 456,356 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 240,704,370, oats 15,378,905, barley 11,551,554, flaxseed 405,731 and rye 3,882,276 bushels, a total of 271,922,836 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 347,354, barley 186,334, flaxseed, 7,914 and rye 6,877 bushels while oats increased 92,123 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 229,324,806, oats 18,221,893, barley 10,807,954, flaxseed 595,416 and rye 4,045,355 bushels, a total of 262,995,424 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 105,553 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 76,533, barley 77,287 and rye 2,242 bushels while oats and flaxseed increased 49,714 and 795 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 18,556 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 19,798 and oats 21,488 bushels while barley increased 22,730 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 506,470 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 388,018, oats 86,630 and barley 32,822 bushels while rye decreased 1,000 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 184,689 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 334 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain same as previous weeks.







Lake shipments for the week ending March 2, 1935 were nil. Lake shipments from August 1, 1934 to date amounted to wheat 49,562 bushels.




