WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending March 8, 1935 shows a decrease of 999,700 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 11,912,033 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 239,802,569 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 240,802,269 bushels for the previous week and 227,890,536 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 20,560,688 bushels, a decrease of 923,778 bushels from the previous week when 21,484,466 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 11,526,660; New York 678,560; Erie 1,707,000; Albany 4,139,000; Duluth 1,619,468; Chicago 647,000 and New Orleans 243,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the United States port stocks except Albany and New Orleans. The largest reductions took place at Buffalo, Milwaukee, Chicago and Erie. For the corresponding week a year ago the wheat stocks amounted to 8,872,685 bushels located as follows: Buffalo 3,041,250; New York 2,072,355; Albany 2,789,000; Boston 635,226; Philadelphia 221,000; Newport News 111,000 and Duluth 2,854 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels as compared with 2,228,643 bushels last year.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 1, 1935 amounted to 2,384,689 bushels, a decrease of 199,740 bushels from the previous week when 2,584,429 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 1,571,352 bushels. For the thirty-one weeks ending March 1, 1935 and March 2, 1934, 187,104,819 bushels and 180,223,070 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This is an increase of 6,881,749 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 1, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending March 2, 1934: Manitoba 189,728 (162,214); Saskatchewan 918,972 (585,140); Alberta 1,275,989 (823,998) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to March 1, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 27,501,630 (23,950,150); Saskatchewan 82,365,007 (89,071,749); Alberta 77,238,182 (67,201,171) bushels.


OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending March 8, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,765,404 bushels as compared with 1,006,700 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 758,704, and a decrease of 144,946 bushels compared with the same week in 1934.



World shipments for the week ending March 11, 1935 amounted to 8,518,000 bushels compared with 10,257,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,616,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the past week North American and Argentine shipments showed decreases of 53,000 and 2,165,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while shipments from Australia showed an increase of 351,000 bushels.

During the first thirty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 321 million bushels compared with 330 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments were lower than last year while Australian shipments were slightly higher. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 115 million bushels of wheat compared with 73 million bushels for the same period in 1933-34.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-two weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-two weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.3 and 12.5 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.2 million bushels per week compared with 4.5 and 6.3 million bushels per week during the first thirty-two weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 2.2 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 8, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 8, 1935 show a net decrease of 1,196,657 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 239,802,569, oats 15,344,404, barley 11,332,147, flaxseed 408,239 and rye 3,874,539 bushels, a total of 270,761,898 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 999,700, oats 23,797, barley 170,778 and rye 3,323 bushels while flaxseed increased 941 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 227,890,536, oats 17,765,802, barley 10,718,052 flaxseed 576,480 and rye 4,034,005 bushels, a total of 260,984,875 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 184,721 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 106,505, oats 40,771, barley 36,877 and rye 1,405 bushels while flaxseed increased 837 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 18,353 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 26,343, and barley 18,366 bushels while wheat decreased 26,356 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 134,802 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 68,439, oats 58,285 and barley 9,358 bushels while rye decreased 1,280 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 98,235 bushels.

VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.





DULUTH.- Receipts of Canadian bonded grain at Duluth by rail for the week ending March 9, 1935 were nil. For the period from August 1, 1934 to date rail receipts amounted to wheat 110,620, oats 194,873 and rye 3,179 bushels.

Receipts by water for the week ending March 9, 1935 were nil. Receipts by water from August 1, 1934 to date amounted to wheat 6,306,019, oats 858,257, barley 1,633,847 and rye 49,906 bushels.

Rail shipments for the week ending March 9, 1935 amounted to wheat 10,000 bushels duty paid. Rail shipments from August 1, 1934 to date amounted to wheat 1,350,067, oats 322,276, and barley 994,755 bushels.
