WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 5, 1935 shows a decrease of 1,408,496 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 7,073,527 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 229,839,299 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 231,247,795 bushels for the previous week and 222,765,772 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 15,179,696 bushels, a net decrease of 1,037,510 bushels from the previous week when 16,217,206 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 7,725,418; New York 812,251; Erie 1,070,000; Albany 4,009,000; Duluth 1,367,027 and New Orleans 196,000 bushels. Decreases took place in all the United States ports except New York and Erie which show increases of 177,363 and 52,000 bushels respectively over the previous week. The largest reduction is shown at Buffalo, while smaller decreases are noted at Albany and New Orleans. For the corresponding week a year ago the Canadian wheat stocks amounted to 4,284,306 bushels located as follows:- Buffalo 901,749; New York 738,361; Albany 2,334,000; Boston 284,568 and Duluth 25,623 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels as compared with 2,228,643 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending March 29, 1935 amounted to 1,762,334 bushels, a decrease of 545,989 bushels from the previous week when 2,308,323 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 1,999,270 bushels. For the thirty-four weeks ending March 29, 1935 and March 30, 1934, 194,565,432 and 188,483,304 bushels were received from the farms. This is an increase of 6,082,123 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending March 29, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending March 30, 1934: Manitoba 184,934 (109,230); Saskatchewan 721,518 (1,082,777); Alberta 855,882 (807,263) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to March 29, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 23,185,576 (24,626,544); Saskatchewan 85,341,995 (92,981,064); Alberta 31,037,861 (70,875,696) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending April 5, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,750,100 bushels as compared with 1,842,277 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 92,177 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 219,049 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 8, 1935 amounted to 9,920,000 bushels compared with 10,751,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,056,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. During the past week North American and Argentine shipments showed increases of 538,000 and 197,000 bushels respectively over the previous week while shipments from Australia decreased 1,726,000 bushels.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-six weeks of the present crop year with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first thirty-six weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 and 12.4 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.1 million bushels per week compared with 4.4 and 6.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-six weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.7 million bushels per week as compared with 2.4 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 5, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 5, 1935 show a net decrease of 2,190,851 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 229,839,299, oats 13,750,217, barley 10,366,536, flaxseed 413,751, rye 3,803,074 bushels, a total of 258,177,877 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,403,496, oats 414,280, barley 360,638 and rye 12,462 bushels while flaxseed increased 5,075 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 222,765,772, oats 16,301,572, barley 10,386,469, flaxseed 547,422 and rye 4,000,800 bushels, a total of 254,002,035 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,088,060 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 652,619, oats 364,377, barley 64,357 and rye 7,504 bushels while flaxseed increased 797 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 361,480 bushels, composed of wheat 304,464, oats 19,845 and barley 37,171 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 528,128 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 484,561 and oats 43,893 bushels while barley decreased 326 bushels.




