WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 19, 1935 shows a decrease of 4,174,673 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 7,410,112 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 221,686,291 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 225,860,964 bushels for the previous week and 214,276,179 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 13,920,654 bushels, a decrease of 486,818 bushels from the previous week when 14,407,472 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 7,142,674, New York 433,551; Erie 908,000; Albany 3,936,000; Duluth 1,310,429 and New Orleans 190,000 bushels. Decreases took place in the wheat stocks in all the United States ports, except Albany and New Orleans. The decreases were as follows: Buffalo 192,869; New York 165,608; Erie 97,000 and Duluth 31,341 bushels. For the corresponding week a year ago Canadian wheat stocks in the United States positions amounted to 3,073,479 bushels located as follows: Buffalo 389,204; New York 960,008; Boston 220,468; Albany 1,498,000 and Duluth 5,799 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels as compared with 2,228,643 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 12, 1935 amounted to 1,756,105 bushels, a decrease of 30,842 bushels from the previous week when 1,786,487 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago, the receipts were 1,733,824 bushels. For the thirty-six weeks ending April 12, 1935 and April 13, 1934, 198,108,024 and 192,390,240 bushels, were received from the farms. This is an increase of 5,717,784 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 12, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending April 13, 1934.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending April 19, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,148,360 bushels as compared with 2,371,468 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 223,108 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 750,762 bushels.


World shipments for the week ending April 22, 1935 amounted to 10,730,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,707,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,464,000 bushels for the corresponding period in 1933-34. Shipments from North America increased slightly this week as compared with the previous week. Clearances from Australia showed an increase of 1,111,000 bushels while Argentine shipments were slightly lower than last week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-eight weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.1 million bushels per week during the first thirty-eight weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 and 12.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.1 million bushels per week compared with 4.3 and 5.9 million bushels per week during the first thirty-eight weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 2.5 million bushels during the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 19, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 19, 1935 show a decrease of 5,423,434 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 221,696,291, oats 12,059,589, barley 9,345,397, flaxseed 402,588 and rye 3,771,739 bushels, a total of 247,265,604 bushels. Decreases were made up as follows:- wheat 4,174,673, oats 932,565, barley 311,199, flaxseed 6,631 and rye 3,366 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 214,276,179, oats 13,825,313, barley 10,135,874, flaxseed 545,162 and rye 3,962,051 bushels, a total of 242,744,579 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Grain in store shows a decrease of 4,257,785 bushels, composed of wheat 5,647,695, oats 539,016, barley 55,691, flaxseed 9,560 and rye 5,823 bushels.


PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks decreased by 332,423 bushels.
