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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending April 26, 1935 shows a decrease of 5,447,789 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 9,361,197 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 216,676,358 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 222,124,147 bushels for the previous week and 207,315,161 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 12,225,680 bushels, a decrease of 1,694,974 bushels from the previous week when 13,920,654 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,737,128; New York 443,110; Erie 906,000; Albany 3,707,000; Duluth 1,243,442 and New Orleans 189,000 bushels. Decreases took place in the wheat stocks in all the United States ports except New York which increased 9,559 bushels. The decreases were as follows: Buffalo 1,405,546; Duluth 66,987; Albany 229,000; Erie 2,000 and New Orleans 1,000 bushels. For the corresponding week a year ago Canadian wheat stocks in the United States positions amounted to 1,518,955 bushels located as follows: Buffalo 98,980; New York 380,068; Albany 905,000; Boston 129,108 and Duluth 5,799 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 1,048,912 bushels as compared with 2,228,460 bushels a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending April 19, 1935 amounted to 1,591,846 bushels, a decrease of 164,259 bushels from the previous week when 1,756,105 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago, the receipts were 1,981,649 bushels. For the thirty-seven week ending April 19, 1935 and April 20, 1934, 199,699,870 and 194,371,889 bushels were received from the farms. This is an increase of 5,327,981 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending April 19, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending April 20, 1934: Manitoba 178,722 (217,828); Saskatchewan 657,077 (896,218); Alberta 756,047 (867,603) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to April 19, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 28,674,148 (25,165,502); Saskatchewan 87,502,751 (95,887,921); Alberta 83,512,971 (73,318,466) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending April 26, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,279,086 bushels as compared with 2,148,360 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 130,726 and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 553,478 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending April 29, 1935, amounted to 8,274,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 10,730,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,928,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933-34. North American and Argentine shipments showed only slight decreases as compared with the previous week. Australian shipments showed a decrease of 1,985,000 bushels as compared with last week.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirty-nine weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1933-34 and 1932-33.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first thirty-nine weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 and 12.3 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.1 million bushels per week compared with 4.3 and 5.9 million bushels per week during the first thirty-nine weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 2.5 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 26, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 26, 1935 show a net decrease of 7,354,777 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 216,676,358, oats 10,441,702, barley 9,009,511, flaxseed 404,707 and rye 3,749,790 bushels, a total of 240,282,068 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 5,457,789, oats 1,605,051, barley 283,120 and rye 11,865 bushels while flaxseed increased 3,048 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 207,315,161, oats 12,676,418, barley 9,800,660 flaxseed 541,379 and rye 3,918,833 bushels, a total of 234,252,451 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a decrease of 5,353,449 bushels. Decreases were as follows:- wheat 3,801,582, oats 1,484,902, barley 57,240, flaxseed 959 and rye 8,766 bushels.


