WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending May 10, 1935 shows a decrease of 1,649,466 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 10,241,179 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 212,605,118 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 214,254,584 for the previous week and 202,363,939 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,014,573 bushels, a decrease of 903,526 bushels from the previous week when 11,918,099 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 5,053,234; New York 435,859; Erie 800,000; Albany 3,242,000; Duluth 1,300,480 and New Orleans 133,000 bushels. Decreases took place in the wheat stocks in all the United States ports except Duluth which increased 39,809 bushels. The decreases were as follows: Buffalo 648,515; New York 117,820; Albany 164,000; Erie 60,000 and New Orleans 3,000 bushels. For the corresponding week a year ago Canadian wheat stocks in the United States positions amounted to 1,682,328 bushels located as follows: Buffalo 580,766; New York 201,404; Albany 476,000; Boston 129,103; Duluth 7,050 and Erie 288,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 787,912 bushels as compared with 704,004 bushels a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 884,138 bushels compared with 1,115,465 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 3, 1935 amounted to 1,250,689 bushels, an increase of 178,239 bushels from the previous week when 1,072,450 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago, the receipts were 346,928 bushels. For the ~~forty~~ weeks ending May 3, 1935 and May 4, 1934, 202,023,009 and 196,754,313 bushels were received from the farms. This is an increase of 5,268,696 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 3, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending May 4, 1934: Manitoba 177,209 (124,987); Saskatchewan 597,938 (373,462); Alberta 475,542 (347,579) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to May 3, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows:-figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 28,927,904 (25,380,555); Saskatchewan 88,628,717 (97,078,388); Alberta 84,466,388 (74,295,370) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending May 10, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,866,883 bushels as compared with 1,961,078 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 905,805 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 400,405 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 10, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 10, 1935 show a decrease of 2,902,725 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 212,605,118, oats 8,736,908, barley 8,954,494, flaxseed 403,703 and rye 3,754,990 bushels, a total of 233,555,213 bushels. Decreases were as follows:- wheat 1,649,466, oats 709,376, barley 515,531, flaxseed 5,576 and rye 22,276 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 202,958,249, oats 11,781,052, barley 9,672,784, flaxseed 532,793 and rye 3,892,553 bushels, a total of 228,837,431 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store this week shows a decrease of 1,522,267 bushels, composed of wheat 1,206,191, oats 275,438, barley 30,012, flaxseed 1,589 and rye 9,037 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 7,325 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat and oats of 5,911 and 2,161 bushels respectively, while barley increased 747 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 400,198 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 245,179, oats 118,561 and barley 33,493 bushels while flaxseed increased 35 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 1,551 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks remain same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store shows a decrease of 308,463 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,299,675 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,772,573, flaxseed 4,220 and rye 2,535 bushels while oats and barley decreased 118,131 and 361,522 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 179,982 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 231,327 and barley 54,544 bushels while oats increased 105,829 bushels.
