WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending June 7, 1935 shows a decrease of 1,189,638 bushels as compared with the previous week and a decrease of over 10,265 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 200,355,758 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 201,545,396 bushels for the previous week and 200,366,023 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

It will be noted that the visible supply is some 10,265 bushels below that of the same date last year. This is the first time since October 26, 1934 that this year's wheat stocks were below those of a year ago.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,603,316 bushels, a net increase of 232,613 bushels over the previous week when 9,370,703 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 4,051,852; New York 1,409,121; Erie 455,000; New Orleans 65,000; Albany 2,826,000; Duluth 716,343; Galveston 80,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in Buffalo stocks of 93,206; Albany of 162,000; and New Orleans of 2,000 bushels. New York and Galveston increased their stocks 486,819 and 3,000 bushels respectively. The amounts in Erie and Duluth remained the same as those of the previous week. For the corresponding week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 6,613,977 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 4,923,888; New York 125,984; Erie 1,510,000; Duluth 4,105 and Albany 20,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 200,294 bushels as compared with 2 bushels a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the Lakes is reported as 3,100,258 bushels compared with 1,483,997 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending May 31, 1935 amounted to 2,200,331 bushels, an increase of 1,121,300 bushels from the previous week's total when 1,078,531 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago, the receipts were 3,426,054 bushels. For the forty-four weeks ending May 31, 1935 and June 1, 1934, 207,067,428 and 205,038,900 bushels were received from the farms. This is an increase of 2,028,528 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending May 31, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending June 1, 1934: Manitoba 315,611 (402,249); Saskatchewan 1,129,619 (1,762,302); Alberta 755,101 (1,262,103) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to May 31, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 29,693,623 (26,313,102); Saskatchewan 91,168,220 (101,138,941); Alberta 86,205,585 (77,586,357) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending June 7, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,315,705 bushels as compared with 2,901,246 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,585,541 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 994,063 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending June 10, 1935 amounted to 8,202,000 bushels as compared with 11,393,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,448,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a sharp reduction of 2,076,000 bushels as compared with the previous week. Australian and Argentine shipments decreased 853,000 and 214,000 bushels respectively as compared with last week.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.2 million bushels per week during the first forty-five weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 and 12.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.1 million bushels per week compared with 4.3 and 5.8 million bushels per week during the first forty-five weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 2.6 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 7, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 7, 1935 show a decrease of 1,813,747 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 200,355,758, oats 6,700,926, barley 6,244,118, flaxseed 370,359 and rye 3,608,582 bushels, a total of 217,279,743 bushels. Decreases were as follows:- wheat 1,189,638, oats 269,060, barley 312,986, flaxseed 324 and rye 41,739 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 200,366,023, oats 10,726,806, barley 9,214,699, flaxseed 500,588 and rye 3,895,459 bushels a total of 224,703,575 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store this week shows a net decrease of 2,066,672 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,975,618, barley 95,755, flaxseed 3,072 and rye 10,696 bushels while oats increased 18,469 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 169,437 bushels, composed of wheat 53,451, oats 44,028, barley 70,672 and flaxseed 1,286 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 90,698 bushels, composed of wheat 80,092, oats 8,365, barley 455 and rye 1,786 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT, VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,685,197 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,354,672, oats 245,481 and barley 110,869 bushels, while increases are shown in flaxseed and rye of 1,588 and 24,237 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 1,680,855 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,616,261 and oats 159,726 bushels while barley decreased 95,132 bushels.






