WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 5 shows a decrease of 1,137,367 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 7,592,619 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 196,046,604 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 197,183,971 bushels for the previous week and 188,453,985 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,612,446 bushels, a net decrease of 666,763 bushels from the previous week when 9,279,209 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 3,542,066; New York 899,739; Albany 2,595,000; Erie 455,000; Duluth 668,641; Galveston 399,000 and New Orleans 53,000 bushels. Decreases in stocks as compared with the previous week were as follows: Buffalo 439,619; New York 334,144 and New Orleans 1,000 bushels, while an increase of 108,000 bushels is shown for Galveston. The stocks at Erie, Albany and Duluth remained the same. For the corresponding week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,448,727 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 6,558,013; Erie 1,615,000; New York 1,048,529; Albany 141,000 and Duluth 86,185 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 1,118,689 bushels compared with 1,525,644 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending June 28 amounted to 2,470,370 bushels, an increase of 766,111 bushels from the previous week's total when 1,704,259 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 2,138,546 bushels. For the forty-eight weeks ending June 28, 1935 and June 29, 1934, 215,981,877 and 216,475,339 bushels were received from the farms. This is a decrease of 493,462 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending June 28, 1935 were as follows:—figures within brackets being those for the week ending June 29, 1934: Manitoba 347,329 (249,236); Saskatchewan 1,235,077 (959,077); Alberta 887,964 (930,233) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to June 28, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 30,705,993 (27,753,972); Saskatchewan 95,492,294 (106,419,150); Alberta 89,783,590 (82,302,217) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending July 5, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,442,503 bushels as compared with 1,795,733 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 353,230 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 457,251 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending July 8, 1935 amounted to 7,102,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 9,608,000 bushels for the previous week and 8,216,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed decreases of 1,229,000 bushels and 1,085,000 bushels respectively.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.0 million bushels per week during the first forty-nine weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 and 11.9 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.0 million bushels per week compared with 4.3 and 5.7 million bushels per week during the first forty-nine weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.6 million bushels per week as compared with 2.6 million bushels during the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 5, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 5, 1935 show a net decrease of 1,966,584 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 196,046,604, oats 5,423,452, barley 4,891,543, flaxseed 299,626 and rye 3,318,524 bushels, a total of 209,979,749. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,137,367, oats 348,795, barley 377,385 and rye 113,688 bushels while flaxseed increased 10,651 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 188,453,985, oats 10,034,706, barley 9,001,424, flaxseed 461,230 and rye 3,616,695 bushels a total of 211,568,040 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store this week shows a decrease of 2,483,104 bushels, composed of wheat 2,383,524, oats 46,059, barley 29,243, flaxseed 11,575 and rye 12,703 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 14,850 bushels, composed of wheat 2,717 and oats 12,133 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 165,963 bushels. Wheat increased 172,475 bushels while decreases are shown in oats of 4,584, barley 142 and rye 1,786 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT, VICTORIA & CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,954,611 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,916,162, oats 24,363, flaxseed 15,021 and rye 7,043 bushels while barley decreased 7,978 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a decrease of 739,677 bushels, composed of wheat 406,955, oats 164,252, barley 143,470 and rye 25,000 bushels.


