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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending July 19 shows a decrease of 2,583,467 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 6,826,204 bushels when compared with the same week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 190,996,-340 bushels as compared with the revised figure of 193,579,807 bushels for the previous week and 184,170,136 bushels for the corresponding week in 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,300,757 bushels, a net increase of 35,063 bushels over the previous week when 8,265,689 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo, 3,656,559; New York 821,557; Galveston 168,000; Albany 2,535,000; Erie 344,000; New Orleans 37,000 and Duluth 668,641 bushels. Decreases in stocks as compared with the previous week were as follows: New York 63,451; Galveston 177,000; New Orleans 10,000 bushels. The Port of Buffalo increased its stocks by 285,519 bushels. The amounts in storage in Albany, Duluth and Erie remained unchanged. For the corresponding week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 8,972,466 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 5,974,150; New York 1,242,300; Erie 1,615,000; Albany 141,000 and Philadelphia 16 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 3,883,223 bushels compared with 1,468,036 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 12 amounted to 2,977,982 bushels, an increase of 246,249 bushels over the previous week's total when 2,731,733 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 2,885,803 bushels. For the fifty weeks ending July 12, 1935 and July 13, 1934, 221,691,592 and 221,620,934 bushels were received from the farms. This is an increase of 70,658 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 12, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending July 13, 1934: Manitoba 233,656 (326,849); Saskatchewan 1,551,895 (1,453,499); Alberta 1,192,431 (1,105,455) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to July 12, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 31,198,102 (28,426,228); Saskatchewan 98,389,123 (108,823,929); Alberta 92,104,367 (84,370,777) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending July 19, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,208,567 bushels as compared with 1,102,239 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 106,328 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 1,285,346 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending July 22, 1935 amounted to 7,784,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 7,557,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,792,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American and Argentine shipments showed increases of 686,000 and 776,000 bushels respectively while shipments from Australia showed a decrease of 1,227,000 bushels.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.9 million bushels per week during fifty-one weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 and 11.9 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 3.0 million bushels per week compared with 4.2 and 5.6 million bushels per week during the fifty-one weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.5 million bushels per week as compared with 2.7 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 19, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 19, 1935 show a net decrease of 3,115,969 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 190,996,340, oats 4,398,471, barley 4,205,060, flaxseed 311,549, and rye 3,142,322 bushels, a total of 203,053,742 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,583,467, oats 378,050 and barley 253,458 bushels, while increases are shown in flaxseed and rye of 6,789 and 92,217 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- Wheat 184,170,136, oats 10,029,593, barley 8,695,579, flaxseed 432,369 and rye 3,587,373 bushels, a total of 206,915,050 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a decrease of 2,976,439 bushels composed of wheat 2,512,765, oats 364,848, barley 69,966, flaxseed 9,675 and rye 19,185 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a decrease of 58,335 bushels, composed of wheat 8,641 and oats 49,694 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 206,403 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 203,917, barley 2,261 and flaxseed 318 bushels, while oats increased 93 bushels.

VICTORIA, PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 3,399,187 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,329,985 and barley 353,269 bushels, while increases are shown in oats of 233,641, flaxseed 14,718 and rye 35,708 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 2,407,956 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,415,187, oats 67,425 and rye 90,000 bushels, while barley decreased 164,656 bushels.
