#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the period ending July 31 shows an increase of 5,181,427 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 9,856,256 bushels when compared with the week ending August 3, 1934. The visible supply was reported as 197,296,515 bushels as compared with the revised figure of 192,215,088 bushels for the previous week and 187,440,259 bushels for the week ending August 3, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,508,498 bushels a net increase of 2,017,702 bushels over the previous week when 8,490,796 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports Buffalo 7,891,456; New York 629,345; Albany 1,467,000; New Orleans 23,000; Eric 27,000 and Duluth 470,697 bushels. Decreases are shown in the stocks in all the ports with the exception of Buffalo, which increased its holdings by 3,246,528 bushels over the previous week. The decreases were as follows: New York 183,018; Albany 601,000; New Orleans 3,000; Eric 152,000; and Duluth 121,808, while Galveston's stocks of 168,000 bushels has been absorbed. For the corresponding week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,727,315 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 5,747,869; Eric 1,615,000; New York 1,494,542; Albany 844,000; Philadelphia 20,000 and Duluth 5,904 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 5,959,571 bushels compared with 4,982,140 bushels for the previous week.

### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending July 26 amounted to 1,942,017 bushels, a decrease of 1,557,143 bushels from the previous week's total when 3,499,160 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 2,250,564 bushels. For the fifty-two weeks ending July 26, 1935 and July 27, 1934, 227,132,769 and 226,808,811 bushels were received from the farms. This is an increase of 323,978 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending July 26, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending July 27, 1934: Manitoba 131,691 (46,984); Saskatchewan 1,029,406 (1,090,134); Alberta 780,920 (1,113,446) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to July 26, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 31,321,743 (28,299,752); Saskatchewan 102,006,612 (110,704,143); Alberta 93,804,414 (86,804,916) bushels.

#### OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the period ending July 31, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,253,866 bushels as compared with 1,722,231 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 468,365 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 1,232,115 bushels.

North American shipments amounted to 2,696,000, Argentine 1,497,000 and Australian 1,466,000 bushels.

## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS -PERIODENDING JULY 31, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the Period ending July 31, 1935 show a net increase of 5,911,142 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 197,296,565, oats 6,032,114, barley 3,859,901, flaxseed 284,402 and rye 2,950,109 bushels, a total of 210,423,091 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 5,081,477, oats 1,101,153 and flaxseed 5,871 bushels while barley and rye decreased 103,842 and 173,517 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 187,440,259, oats 10,463,465, barley 9,049,223, flaxseed 449,877 and rye 3,868,892 bushels, a total of 211,271,716 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store this week shows an decrease of 2,372,462 bushels, composed of wheat 2,160,171, oats 123,527, barley 65,480, flaxseed 12,357 and rye 10,927 bushels.


INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a decrease of 53,948 bushels, composed of wheat 53,595 and oats 353 bushels.

VANCCUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 116,288 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 116,895 and oats 176 bushels while barley increased 783 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT, VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS: - Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain in store shows a net increase of 283,467 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 1,178,359, barley 8,467 and flaxseed 21,611 bushels while wheat and rye decreased 875,735 and 49,235 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 941,631 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 977,431 and oats 11,508 bushels while barley decreased 47,308 bushels.


