

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 7, 1934 shows an increase of 7,891,991 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 201,821,915 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 193,929,924 bushels for the previous week and 205,242,924 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 10,299,995 bushels of which 4,552,932 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,243,547 bushels at New York, 1,583,000 bushels at Erie and 2,236,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 6,006,543 bushels on the same date last year of which 3,159,683 bushels were located at Buffalo, 800,188 bushels at New York and 1,983,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with 3,728,762 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 4,207,519 bushels compared with 2,458,518 bushels for the previous week and 6,247,755 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending August 31, 1934 amounted to 16,491,316 bushels, an increase of 7,470,329 bushels over the previous week when 9,020,987 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 9,239,547 bushels. For the five weeks ending August 31, 1934 and September 2, 1933, 31,527,037 and 27,137,962 bushels respectively were received from the farms. By provinces the receipts for the week ending August 31, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending September 1, 1933: Manitoba 6,850,491 (2,883,686) bushels; Saskatchewan 6,613,777 (4,885,643) bushels; Alberta 3,027,048 (1,470,218) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to August 31, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933-34 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933-34: Manitoba 10,438,358 (10,539,460) bushels; Saskatchewan 12,181,654 (11,076,501) bushels; Alberta 8,907,025 (5,522,001) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending September 7, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,708,694 bushels compared with 3,676,079 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 967,385 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 3, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 8, 1934 show a net increase of 8,345,847 bushels compared with the revised figures of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 201,821,935, oats 10,964,971, barley 10,533,515, flaxseed 470,901 and rye 4,230,129 bushels, a total of 228,026,429 bushels. Increases were shown in wheat of 7,691,991, oats 305,572, barley 511,959, flaxseed 1,515 and rye 132,810 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 205,242,924, oats 13,757,489, barley 9,405,596, flaxseed 1,013,574 and rye 5,490,331 bushels, a total of 234,909,914 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain this week show an increase of 3,040,907 bushels. Increases were in wheat 2,921,551, oats 91,676, barley 18,298 and rye 9,777 bushels while flaxseed decreased 695 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS: Stocks for the week show a net increase of 145,230 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 136,064, oats 1,985, barley 5,041 and flaxseed of 146 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS: - Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 909,098 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 770,800, oats 94,554 and barley 43,704 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR: - Grain stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR: - Wheat stocks show an increase of 323,934 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR: - Wheat stocks show a decrease of 216 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR): - Stocks for the week show an increase of 3,172,149 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 1,671,564, oats 18,835, barley 501,359, flaxseed 1,935 and rye 178,476 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES: - Grain in transit shows a net increase of 1,627,875 bushels. Increases were in wheat 1,749,001 and barley 297,328 while oats show a decrease of 418,454 bushels.
