WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 14, 1934 shows an increase of 13,256,811 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 216,863,948 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 203,607,133 bushels for the previous week and 212,129,649 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,579,502 bushels of which 6,199,081 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,117,359 bushels at New York, 1,575,000 bushels at Erie and 2,289,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 4,864,583 bushels on the same date last year of which 2,570,222 bushels were located at Buffalo, 207,530 bushels at New York and 1,981,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 657,136 bushels compared with 3,699,096 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,896,580 bushels compared with 4,207,519 bushels for the previous week and 5,846,340 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 7, 1934 amounted to 15,573,590 bushels, a decrease of 917,726 bushels from the previous week when 16,491,316 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 10,520,340 bushels. For the six weeks ending September 7, 1934 and September 8, 1933, 47,100,627 and 37,658,302 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows that more wheat has been marketed during the six weeks' period in 1934 than for the same period in 1933 by 9,442,325 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 7, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending September 8, 1933; Manitoba 2,985,337 (2,203,151) bushels; Saskatchewan 7,837,653 (5,868,928) bushels; Alberta 4,750,600 (2,448,261) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to September 7, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933-34 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933-34: Manitoba 13,423,695 (12,742,611) bushels; Saskatchewan 20,019,307 (16,945,429) bushels; Alberta 13,657,625 (7,970,262) bushels;

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending September 14, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,878,624 bushels compared with 2,708,694 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 169,930 bushels.

EXPORTS VIA SHIPPING ROUTES

Wheat exports - month of August, 1934. According to Canadian Customs returns 14,709,675 bushels of wheat valued at \$12,868,422 were exported from Canada during the month of August, 1934. This compared with 8,652,970 bushels valued at \$6,656,511 for the same month 1933. The routing of the exports during August, 1934 shows that 371,076 bushels were exported to the United States for consumption while 5,272,889 bushels were exported to the United States for export overseas. The balance amounting to 9,065,710 bushels were exported from Canadian seaboard ports, 5,702,375 bushels moving from Atlantic ports and 3,363,335 bushels from Pacific ports. Re-routed wheat during the month of August amounted to 467,733 bushels. This increased the wheat movement via Canadian ports to 9,533,443 bushels and decreased the exports via United States ports 4,805,156 bushels.

WHEATFLOUR EXPORTS

During the month of August, 1934, 36 barrels of wheatflour were exported to the United States direct for consumption, 40,678 barrels moved via United States ports for export overseas, and 298,814 barrels were exported via Canadian Atlantic ports while 72,561 barrels were exported from Canadian Pacific Ports. The total export for the month amounted to 412,089 barrels valued at \$1,570,580 compared with 480,288 barrels valued \$1,948,441 during the same month in 1933.


WHEAT AND WHEAT FLOUR

The combined exports of wheat and wheat flour (the latter reduced to bushels $4\frac{1}{2}$ to the barrel) amounted to 16,564,076 bushels valued at \$14,439,002 compared with 10,814,265 bushels valued at \$8,604,952 for the same month in 1933. Of the former amount 371,238 bushels went to the United States for consumption, 5,455,940 bushels were exported to the United States ports for export overseas, 7,047,038 bushels were moved direct from Canadian Atlantic ports and 3,689,860 bushels were shipped overseas from Canadian Pacific ports, making a total via Canadian ports of 16,192,838 bushels. Re-routed wheat from United States lake ports during the month of August was reported as 467,733 bushels, which added to the movement via Canadian ports increased same to 11,204,631 bushels. Deduction of same amount from United States ports decreased the quantity to be exported from United States Atlantic ports to 4,988,207 bushels.

COARSE GRAINS

Oats exported during the month of August, 1934 amounted to 1,075,756 bushels, a gratifying increase over the previous month when 855,836 bushels were exported. For the month of August a year ago exports were only 237,569 bushels. Of the first amount 196,877 bushels went to the United States for consumption while the balance moved through Canadian ports as follows:- Canadian Atlantic ports 301,185 bushels and Canadian Pacific ports 277,694 bushels.

Barley exports also show a substantial increase over the previous month and the corresponding month in 1933. The exports for the month of August, 1934 was 1,134,501 bushels compared with 493,809 bushels for the previous month and 58,954 bushels for the same month a year ago. Of the first amount 356,307 bushels went to the United States for consumption while the balance moved through the following Canadian ports. Canadian Atlantic ports 718,943 bushels, Canadian Pacific ports 59,251 bushels. Rye exports amounted to 166,745 bushels compared with 160,103 bushels for the same month in 1933. No exports for rye was shown for July, 1934. The bulk of the first quantity amounting to 132,461 bushels went to the United States for consumption, while 34,284 bushels moved from Canadian Atlantic ports. There was only one bushel of flaxseed exported during the month of August, 1934.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 14, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 14, 1934 show a net increase of 14,904,719 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 216,863,948, oats 11,149,634, barley 12,363,682, flaxseed 494,495 and rye 4,195,972 bushels, a total of 245,067,731 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 13,256,815, oats 321,670, barley 1,368,255 and flaxseed 16,247 bushels while rye decreased 58,268 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 212,129,649, oats 14,422,516, barley 10,074,764, flaxseed 969,004 and rye 5,351,585 bushels, a total of 242,947,518 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks this week show an increase of 7,854,771 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 7,093,609, oats 325,787, barley 402,906, flaxseed 15,631 and rye 16,838 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show an increase of 555,202 bushels, made up of wheat 539,635 and oats 15,567 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 1,863,351 bushels, made up as follows:- wheat 1,837,047, oats 17,648 and barley 13,656 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR:- Wheat stocks show a decrease of 13,583 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain stocks show a net increase of 1,465,330 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,000,116, barley 662,517 and flaxseed 324 bushels while oats and rye decreased 67,393 and 130,234 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES:- Grain in transit shows a decrease of 251,671 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 310,939, and oats 38,076 bushels. While barley and rye increased 79,366 and 67,978 bushels respectively.


