WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending September 21, 1934 shows an increase of 7,565,105 bushels as compared with the previous week. The visible supply was reported as 224,941,484 bushels as compared with a revised figure of 217,376,379 bushels for the previous week and 218,442,464 bushels for the corresponding week in 1933.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 11,892,232 bushels of which 6,122,136 bushels were in store at Buffalo, 1,251,659 bushels at New York 1,833,000 bushels at Erie and 2,256,000 bushels at Albany, N.Y. This compared with 4,616,293 bushels on the same date last year of which 2,274,348 bushels were located at Buffalo, 336,163 bushels at New York and 1,879,000 bushels at Erie.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 846,620 bushels compared with 3,677,334 bushels last year.

In transit wheat on the lakes amounted to 3,780,912 bushels compared with 3,896,580 bushels for the previous week and 4,614,522 bushels for the corresponding date in 1933.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending September 14, 1934 amounted to 22,565,311 bushels, an increase of 6,991,721 bushels over the previous week when 15,573,590 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 14,949,480 bushels. For the seven weeks ending September 14, 1934 and September 15, 1933, 69,665,938 bushels and 52,607,782 bushels respectively were received from the farms. This shows a gain of 17,058,156 bushels over the same period a year ago. By provinces the receipts for the week ending September 14, 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the week ending September 15, 1933: Manitoba 5,684,369 (3,156,560) bushels; Saskatchewan 10,977,625 (7,590,672) bushels; Alberta 5,903,317 (4,202,248) bushels.

Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces up to September 14, 1934 as compared with the same period in 1933-34 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1933-34: Manitoba 19,108,064 (15,899,172); Saskatchewan 30,996,932 (24,536,101) bushels; Alberta 19,560,942 (12,172,510) bushels.

EXPORT CLEARANCES


During the week ending September 21, 1934 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,402,691 bushels compared with 2,878,624 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 524,067 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending September 24, 1934 amounted to 9,367,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 11,017,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,168,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and the Argentine showed decreases of 881,000 and 1,007,000 bushels respectively, as compared with the previous week, while Australian shipments showed a slight increase.

During the first eight weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 84 million bushels compared with 82 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American and Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. Since August 1, 1934 the Argentine has cleared 32 million bushels of wheat compared with 23 million bushels for the same period in 1933.



As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 10.5 million bushels per week during the first eight weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.2 and 8.9 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1933-34 and 1932-33. North American shipments have averaged 4.1 million bushels per week compared with 4.2 and 5.4 million bushels per week during the first eight weeks of 1933-34 and 1932-33. Argentine shipments have averaged 3.9 million bushels per week as compared with 2.9 million bushels during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 21, 1934.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 21, 1934 show a net increase of 8,737,038 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 224,941,484, oats 11,622,848, barley 13,594,163, flaxseed 517,463 and rye 4,111,872 bushels, a total of 254,787,830 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 7,565,105, oats 169,102, barley 1,096,909 and flaxseed 10,163 bushels while rye decreased 104,241 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 218,442,464, oats 15,158,569, barley 10,351,947, flaxseed 969,754 and rye 5,104,863 bushels, a total of 250,927,597 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.— Grain in store this week shows an increase of 1,811,495 bushels, made up as follows:— wheat 1,453,535, oats 81,093, barley 259,511, flaxseed 4,601 and rye 12,755 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.— Stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,211,271 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,205,145 and oats 6,272 bushels while flaxseed decreased 146 bushels.

VANCOUVER - NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.— Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,050,161 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,045,406 and barley 19,342 bushels while oats decreased 14,587 bushels.

PRINCE FUPERT ELEVATOR.— Grain stocks remain same as previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.—Wheat stocks decreased 424,431 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.— Wheat stocks decreased 334 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).—Grain in store shows a net increase of 4,452,718 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 2,942,696, oats 310,563 and barley 1,291,814 bushels while flaxseed and rye decreased 51,996 and 40,359 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.—Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 721,266 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 115,668, oats 258,826, barley 534,421 and rye 67,978 bushels while flaxseed increased 55,627 bushels.


