WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the period ending August 9, shows a decrease of 3,497,219 bushels as compared with the previous week and an increase of 8,547,699 bushels when compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 193,799,296 bushels as compared with the revised figure of 196,984,365 bushels for the previous week and 187,231,597 bushels for the week ending August 10, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 12,006,507 bushels a net increase of 1,498,009 bushels over the previous week when 10,508,498 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Buffalo 9,573,093; New York 660,712; Albany 1,454,000; Erie 27,000; New Orleans 21,000; and Duluth 1,479,697 bushels. Buffalo and New York stocks show increases of 1,481,642 and 31,367 bushels respectively over the previous week's totals while decreases are noted at Albany of 13,000 and at New Orleans of 2,000 bushels. The stocks at Duluth and Erie remained the same as those of the previous week. For the corresponding week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 9,534,852 bushels distributed as follows: Buffalo 4,391,177; Erie 1,615,000; New York 1,487,852; Albany 1,867,000; and Duluth 223,853 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 6,958,157 bushels compared with 5,959,571 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the period ending July 31, amounted to 2,616,541 bushels an increase of 674,524 bushels over the previous week's total when 1,942,017 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding period a year ago the receipts were 953,951 bushels. For the year ending July 31, 1935 and July 31, 1934 229,749,310 and 227,631,265 bushels were received from the farms. This is an increase of 12,118,045 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the period ending July 31, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for the period ending July 31, 1934: Manitoba 294,538 (131,946); Saskatchewan 1,157,787 (328,029); Alberta 1,164,216 (493,976) bushels.


Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces to July 31, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 31,616,281 (28,411,617); Saskatchewan 103,164,399 (112,003,702); Alberta 94,968,630 (87,215,946) bushels.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the period ending August 9, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 1,597,326 bushels as compared with 1,253,866 bushels for the previous week an increase of 343,460 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 1,156,822 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending August 12, 1935 amounted to 6,345,000 bushels as compared with shipments of 6,283,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,720,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a decrease of 1,163,000 bushels as compared with the previous week. While shipments from the Argentine showed an increase of 1,438,000 bushels.

During the first two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 13 million bushels as compared with 22 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. North American shipments amounted to only 4 million bushels this year as compared with 8 million bushels in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 9, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 9, 1935, show a net decrease of 3,963,750 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 193,799,296, oats 5,860,253, barley 3,265,480, flaxseed 287,098 and rye 2,878,904 bushels, a total of 206,091,031 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,185,069, oats 125,499, barley 590,499 and rye 67,286 bushels while flaxseed increased 4,603 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 187,231,597, oats 10,625,565, barley 8,618,155, flaxseed 453,104 and rye 3,788,898 bushels, a total of 210,717,319 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks this week show a net decrease of 897,459 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 924,224, and rye 1,767 bushels while increases are noted in oats of 17,766, barley 5,870 and flaxseed 4,896 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 80,585 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 61,705 and oats 19,589 bushels while flaxseed increased 709 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 282,142 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 281,742 and rye 439 bushels while oats decreased 39 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT, VICTORIA AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 8,644,750 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 8,601,050, barley 46,966 and flaxseed 63,820 bushels, while increases are shown in oats and rye 55,718 and 11,372 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 858,084 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 995,586, barley 28,335 and flaxseed 72,000 bushels while oats and rye decreased 170,927 and 69,910 bushels respectively.
