WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 11 shows an increase of 9,803,239 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 18,334,758 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 255,911,877 bushels compared with the revised figure of 246,108,638 bushels for the previous week and 237,577,119 bushels for the week ending October 12, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 24,182,598 bushels, a net increase of 2,621,973 bushels over the previous week when 21,560,625 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 926,896; Buffalo 17,419,506; Erie 1,048,000; New York 298,384; Albany 4,077,000 and Galveston 67,000 bushels. Increases are shown in the stocks of wheat at Buffalo of 1,284,506; Erie 1,048,000; New York 318,812 bushels, while a decrease is noted at Duluth of 29,345 bushels. The Canadian wheat stocks at Albany and Galveston remained the same as those of the previous week, viz., 4,077,000 and 67,000 bushels respectively. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 16,021,584 bushels located as follows: Duluth 508,967; Buffalo 9,607,796; Erie 1,977,000; New York 628,821; Albany 3,147,000 and Philadelphia 152,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago. Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 5,973,062 bushels compared with 5,575,785 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT


Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 4 amounted to 18,513,938 bushels, a slight increase over the previous week's total when 18,048,483 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,457,256 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 4, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 1,884,450 (426,484); Saskatchewan 8,698,031 (5,229,569); Alberta 7,931,457 (2,801,203) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1, to October 4, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 9,866,338 (21,849,787); Saskatchewan 57,432,364 (45,708,513); Alberta 30,161,346 (26,545,274) bushels. For the nine weeks ending October 4, 1935 and October 5, 1934, 97,460,048 and 94,203,574 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 11, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,599,319 bushels as compared with 3,094,849 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 495,530 and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 290,603 bushels.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 11, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 11, 1935 show an increase of 11,737,711 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 255,911,877, oats 12,540,116, barley 9,310,270, flaxseed 509,096 and rye 4,009,742 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 9,803,239, oats 1,133,031, barley 591,693, flaxseed 112,607 and rye 97,141 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 237,577,119, oats 13,113,673, barley 14,359,366, flaxseed 556,941 and rye 4,075,638 bushels a total of 269,682,737 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- Stocks in store show an increase of 4,702,540 bushels made up as follows:- wheat 4,283,865, oats 223,684, barley 82,126, flaxseed 84,036 and rye 28,829 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC & SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 789,320 bushels. Wheat and oats increased 783,983 and 5,882 bushels respectively, while barley decreased 5,545 bushels.


VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,381,738 bushels. Wheat and oats increased 1,375,467 and 7,316, bushels respectively while barley decreased 5,545 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain same as for the previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 709,755 bushels. Increases are noted in oats of 266,064, barley 391,946, flaxseed 20,894 and rye 69,011 bushels while wheat decreased 38,160 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 706,057 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat 397,277, oats 275,964 and barley 72,816 bushels, while rye decreased 40,000 bushels.
