WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 18, shows an increase of 6,530,526 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 15,975,280 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 261,509,251 bushels compared with the revised figure of 254,978,725 bushels for the previous week and 245,533,971 bushels for the week ending October 19, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,723,124 bushels, a net increase of 3,540,526 bushels over the previous week when 24,182,598 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports, Duluth 1,046,483, Buffalo 20,069,873, Erie 1,748,000, New York 652,768, Albany 4,139,000 and Galveston 67,000 bushels. Increases are shown in all the stocks of Canadian wheat in store in all elevators and afloat over those of the previous week and are as follows:- Duluth 119,587, Buffalo 2,650,367, Erie 673,000, New York 35,572, and Albany 62,000 bushels. The stocks at Galveston remained the same as those of week ago, viz 67,000 bushels. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,771,567 bushels located as follows:- Duluth 498,415, Buffalo 11,206,415, Erie 1,977,000, New York 882,737, Albany 3,147,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada was shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago. Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 5,442,809 bushels compared with 5,973,062 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 11 amounted to 16,647,313 bushels, a decrease of 1,866,625 bushels from the previous week's total when 18,513,938 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 15,440,267 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 11, 1935 were as follows:- figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 610,916 (1,072,379); Saskatchewan 8,038,259 (6,380,893); Alberta 7,998,138 (7,986,995) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to October 11, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 10,477,254 (22,922,166; Saskatchewan 65,470,623 (52,089,406); Alberta 38,159,484 (34,632,269). For the ten weeks ending October 11, 1935 and October 12, 1934, 114,107,361 and 109,643,841 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 18, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,045,111 bushels as compared with 2,599,319 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 554,208 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 630,594 bushels.

According to the Department of Commerce, Washington, D.C., returns from August 3, to October 12, 1935 show imports of wheat for consumption duty paid as 4,201,000 bushels and imports into bonded mills for grinding as 1,821,000 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending October 21, 1935 amounted to 10,705,000 bushels as compared with 9,862,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,664,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and the Argentine showed decreases of 441,000 bushels and 513,000 bushels, respectively as compared with the previous week. While Australian shipments showed an increase of 701,000 bushels.

During the first twelve weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 105 million bushels as compared with 129 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 35 million bushels as compared with 48 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 28 million bushels as compared with 47 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twelve weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 8.8 million bushels per week during the first twelve weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.7 and 10.0 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 2.9 million bushels per week compared with 4.0 and 4.5 million bushels per week during the first twelve weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.3 million bushels per week as compared with 3.9 million bushels per week during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 18, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 18, 1935 show an increase of 7,730,291 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 261,509,251, oats 13,261,712, barley 9,797,393, flaxseed 620,081 and rye 4,274,737 bushels, a total of 289,463,174 bushels. Increases noted were as follows: wheat 6,530,526, oats 425,390, barley 438,120, flaxseed 90,980 and rye 245,275 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 245,533,971, oats 14,094,026, barley 14,495,510, flaxseed 603,527 and rye 3,941,090 bushels, a total of 278,668,124 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks this week show an increase of 2,022,440 bushels, composed of wheat 1,835,864, oats 18,466, barley 88,669, flaxseed 32,702 and rye 46,739 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 1,235,146 bushels, composed of wheat 1,218,321, oats 13,865 and barley 2,960 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 104,287 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks increased 69,140 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 687,148 bushels. Wheat decreased 1,380,960 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 410,093, barley 167,159, flaxseed 40,212 and rye 76,348 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 542,900 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 530,253, and oats 110,489 bushels while barley increased 97,842 bushels.
