#### WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending October 25, shows an increase of 3,056,273 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 16,477,146 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 266,092,470 bushels compared with the revised figure of 262,436,197 bushels for the previous week and 249,615,324 bushels for the week ending October 26, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 29,915,764 bushels a net increase of 2,192,640 bushels over the previous week, when 27,723,124 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports - Duluth 929,658; Buffalo 21,124,000; Erie 2,428,000; New York 1,230,106; Albany 4,139,000 and Galveston 65,000 bushels. Increases over the previous week are shown in the wheat stocks at Buffalo of 1,054,127; Erie 680,000 and New York 577,338 bushels, while decreases are noted at Duluth of 116,825 and Galveston 2,000 bushels. Wheat stocks at Albany remained the same as those of a week ago viz 4,139,000 bushels. For the same week ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 17,213,477 bushels distributed as follows:- Duluth 277,307; Buffalo 10,689,598; Erie 1,977,000; New York 630,572; Albany 3,579,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago. Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 4,518,096 bushels compared with 5,442,809 bushels for the previous week.

#### PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending October 18 amounted to 13,311,730 bushels a decrease of 3,335,583 bushels from the previous week's total when 16,647,313 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 12,960,738 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending October 18, 1935 were as follows:— figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 1,323,914 (915,611); Saskatchewan 6,803,972 (5,749,579): Alberta 5,183,844 (6,295,548) bushels, Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to October 18, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 11,801,168 (23,837,777): Saskatchewan 72,274,595 (57,838,985); Alberta 43,343,328 (40,927,817) bushels. For the eleven weeks ending October 18, 1935 and October 19,1934, 127,419,091 and 122,604,579 bushels were received from the farms.

#### OVERSEAS EXFORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending October 25, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,655,136 bushels as compared with 2,045,111 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 610,025 and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 756,085 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending October 28, 1935 amounted to 9,295,000 bushels as compared with 10,705,000 for the previous week and 9,416,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and the Argentina showed only slight increases as compared with the previous week while Australian shipments showed a decrease of 483,000 bushels.


During the first thirteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 115 million bushels as compared with 138 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 38 million bushels as compared with 52 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 29 million bushels as compared with 49 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

#### Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first thirteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 8.8 million bushels per week during the first thirteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.6 and 10.0 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 2.9 million bushels per week compared with 4.0 and 4.5 million bushels per week during the first thirteen weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.3 million bushels per week as compared with 3.7 million bushels per week during the same period last year.



Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 25,1935 show an increase of 4,242,376 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 266,092,470, oats 13,533,509, barley 10,103,020, flaxseed 716,073 and rye 4,354,592 bushels, a total of 294,799,664 bushels. Increases noted were as follows:- wheat 3,656,273, oats 141,209, barley 302,802,flaxseed 75,388 and rye 66,704 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 249,615,324, oats 15,194,708, barley 14,744,495, flaxseed 599,554 and rye 4,040,653 bushels, a total of 284,194,734 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store this week shows a net increase of 1,670,770 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,510,410, oats 94,627, barley 19,777 and flaxseed 47,851 bushels while rye decreased 1,895 bushels.



PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR: - Wheat stocks show an increase of 157,430 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVADOR: - Wheat stocks show an increase of 328,985 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR): - Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,517,249 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 682,410, oats 809,617, barley 58,290 and flaxseed 35,586 while rye increased 68,654 bushels.
