WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 8 shows a decrease of 1,610,383 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 15,246,202 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 269,139,064 bushels compared with the revised figure of 270,749,447 bushels for the previous week and 255,503,245 bushels for the week ending November 9, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,891,400 bushels, a net decrease of 157,990 bushels from the previous week when 32,049,390 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 1,305,363; Buffalo 21,529,000; Erie 2,428,000; New York 1,810,037; Albany 4,639,000 and Galveston 180,000 bushels. Decreases from the previous week are shown in the stocks of Canadian wheat at Duluth and Buffalo of 34,430 and 479,000 bushels respectively, while increases are noted at New York of 350,440 and Galveston 5,000 bushels. The stocks at Erie and Albany remained the same as those of a week ago, viz., 2,428,000 and 4,639,000 bushels respectively. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,242,903 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 536,892; Buffalo 12,123,754; Erie 1,977,000; New York 966,257; Albany 3,579,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels. Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 4,491,221 bushels compared with 5,708,488 bushels for the previous week.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 1, amounted to 7,822,271 bushels, a decrease of 3,845,577 bushels from the previous week's total when 11,657,848 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 8,073,798 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 1, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 529,324 (418,515); Saskatchewan 4,229,196 (3,336,156); Alberta 3,063,751 (4,319,127) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1, to November 1, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows: Manitoba 13,151,561 (24,807,966); Saskatchewan 82,824,250 (65,260,042); Alberta 50,923,399 (50,359,415) bushels. For the thirteen weeks ending November 1, 1935 and November 2, 1934, 146,899,210 and 140,427,423 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 8, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,110,873 bushels as compared with 4,578,470 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 1,467,597 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 110,327 bushels.



According to the Department of Commerce, Washington, D.C., returns from August 3, 1935 to November 2, 1935 show imports of wheat for consumption duty paid as 8,653,000 bushels and imports into bonded mills for grinding as 2,844,000 bushels. For the same period in 1934 the imports for consumption duty paid were 3,840,000 bushels and imports into bonded mills for grinding 3,496,000 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending November 11, 1935 amounted to 10,647,000 bushels compared with 10,672,000 bushels for the previous week and 12,368,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Argentina showed only slight increases as compared with the previous week while Australian shipments showed a decrease of 624,000 bushels.

During the first fifteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 138 million bushels as compared with 161 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 49 million bushels as compared with 60 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 33 million bushels as compared with 55 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first fifteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.2 million bushels per week during the first fifteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.7 and 10.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 3.2 million bushels per week compared with 4.0 and 4.5 million bushels per week during the first fifteen weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.2 million bushels per week as compared with 3.6 million bushels per week during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 8, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 8, 1935 show a net decrease of 2,296,337 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 269,139,062, oats 13,599,382, barley 9,950,346, flaxseed 750,476 and rye 4,500,467 bushels, a total of 297,939,733 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,610,385, oats 325,546, barley 357,791 and flaxseed 44,096 bushels, while rye increased 41,281 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 255,503,245, oats 15,065,229, barley 14,109,730, flaxseed 637,170 and rye 4,065,481 bushels, a total of 289,380,855 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 806,401 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 848,925 and flaxseed 4,678 bushels while increases are shown in oats of 20,494, barley 13,053 and rye 13,655 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 333,480 bushels. Increases were as follows:- wheat 321,268, oats 7,893, barley 4,228 and flaxseed 91 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 325,933 bushels. Increases were noted in wheat of 286,610, and oats 46,363 bushels while decreases were shown in barley and rye of 3,392 and 3,648 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 21,367 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 406,159 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,486,289 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 974,471, oats 415,268, barley 54,386 and flaxseed 66,001 bushels while rye increased 23,837 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a decrease of 1,707,649 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,217,267, oats 148,002, barley 336,441 and rye 60,000 bushels while flaxseed increased 54,061 bushels.





CANADIAN GRAIN IN STORE - NOVEMBER 8, 1935.






