WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 15 shows a decrease of 1,680,606 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 11,577,775 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 267,485,690 bushels compared with the revised figure of 269,166,296 bushels for the previous week and 255,907,915 bushels for the week ending November 16, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,714,122 bushels a net increase of 822,722 bushels over the previous week when 31,891,400 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 1,131,917; Buffalo 22,432,000; Erie 2,428,000; New York 1,914,205; Albany 4,639,000 and Galveston 169,000 bushels. Increases are shown over the previous week's stocks at Buffalo and New York of 903,000 and 104,168 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted at Duluth of 173,446 bushels and at Galveston of 11,000 bushels. Stocks at Erie and Albany remained the same as those of the previous week viz: 2,428,000 and 4,639,000 bushels respectively. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 19,632,971 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 480,485; Buffalo 12,333,982; Erie 2,205,000; New York 974,504; Albany 3,579,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the Lakes is reported as 4,801,873 bushels compared with 4,491,221 bushels for the previous week.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels compared with the same amount at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 8 amounted to 4,886,606 bushels, a decrease of 2,985,665 bushels from the previous week's total when 7,822,271 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 6,952,855 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 8, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 465,719 (293,097); Saskatchewan 2,746,186 (2,594,439); Alberta 1,674,701 (4,065,319) bushels. Marketings for three Prairie Provinces from August 1, to November 8, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows: Manitoba 13,617,280 (25,101,063); Saskatchewan 85,570,436 (67,854,481); Alberta 52,598,100 (54,424,734) bushels. For the fourteen weeks ending November 8, 1935 and November 9, 1934, 151,785,816 and 147,380,278 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 15, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,611,209 bushels as compared with 3,110,873 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 500,336 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 1,065,337 bushels.

According to the Department of Commerce, Washington, D.C., returns from August 3, 1935 to November 9, 1935 show imports of wheat for consumption duty paid as 10,824,000 bushels and imports into bonded mills for grinding as 3,025,000 bushels. For the same period in 1934 the imports for consumption duty paid were 3,973,000 bushels and imports into bonded mills for grinding 3,496,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 15, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 15, 1935 show a net decrease of 1,952,111 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 267,485,690, oats 13,482,228, barley 9,757,291, flaxseed 711,187 and rye 4,523,864 bushels, a total of 295,960,260 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 1,680,606, oats 48,315, barley 204,915 and flaxseed 28,290 bushels, while rye increased 10,015 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 255,907,915, oats 15,402,215, barley 13,426,121, flaxseed 597,713 and rye 3,990,627 bushels, a total of 289,324,591 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 146,150 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 174,438 and oats 5,192 bushels while increases were shown in barley of 27,392, flaxseed 3,952 and rye 2,136 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 70,003 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 66,561 and barley 4,142 bushels while oats decreased 700 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 764 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 37,189 and barley 1,356 bushels while oats increased 37,781 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks remain same as previous week.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Wheat in store increased 477,955 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks show a net decrease of 3,062,343 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 2,960,941, oats 93,000 and barley 58,760 bushels, while increases were shown in flaxseed of 25,078 and rye 25,280 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit shows a net increase of 123,465 bushels. An increase was noted in wheat of 310,652 bushels while decreases were shown in oats of 43,711, barley 52,421 and flaxseed 91,055 bushels.




