

WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 22 shows a decrease of 3.400,027 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 6,888,240 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 264,288,316 bushels compared with the revised figure of 267,694,343 bushels for the revious week and 257,400,076 bushels for the week ending November 23, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 30,412,726 bushels, a net decrease of 2,301,396 bushels from the previous week when 32,714,122 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 2,070,734; Buffalc 19,846,000; Frie 2,428,000; New York 1,812,992; Albany 5,087,000 and Calveston 168,000 bushels. Decreases are shown from the previous week's stocks at Buffalo of 2.586,000; New York 101,213; Duluth 61,183 and Galveston 1,000 bushels, while an increase noted at Albany of 448,000 bushels. Stocks at Eric remained the same as those of a week ago, @iz. 2,428,000 bushels. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 21,601,594 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 710,146; Buffalo 13,238,593; Erls 2,205,000; New York 1,529,855; Albany 3,858,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 3,938,329 bushels compared with 4,801,873 bushels for the previous week.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels compared with 1,048,912 bushels at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 15 amounted to 3,727,945 bushels, a decrease of 1,158.661 bushels from the previous week's total when 4,886,606 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 6,219,496 bushels. By provinces the receipts for the week ending November 15,1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitcha 415,321 (240,829); Saskatchewan 1,654,728 (2.623,752); Alberta 1,657,896 (3,354,915) bushels. Marketings for the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to Movember 15 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows: Manitoba 14,032,601 (25,341,892); Saskatchewan 87,225,164 (70,478,233); Alberta 54,255,996) (57,779,649) bushels. For the fifteen weeks ending November 15, 1935 and November 16, 1934, 155, 513, 761 and 153, 599, 774 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 22, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,879,482 bushels as compared with 3,631,209 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 248,273 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 956,053 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending November 25, 1935 amounted to 8,128,000 bushels compared with 10,133,000 bushels for the preceding week and 10,312,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed decreases of 685,000 bushels and 1,609,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Argentine shipments showed a slight increase:


During the first seventeen weeks of the prosent crop year world shipments amounted to 159 million bushels as compared with 181 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were alightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 58 million bushels as compared with 66 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 35 million bushels as compared with 63 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first seventeen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.4 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.7 and 10.1 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 3.4 million bushels per week compared with 3.9 and 4.7 million bushels per week during the first seventeen weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.1 million bushels per week as compared with 3.7 million bushels per week during the same period last year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 22, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 22,1935 show a net decrease of 5,124,293 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 264,238,316, oats 12,873,221, barley 9.506,366, flarseed 691,047 and rye 4,576,244 bushels, a total of 291,935,194 bushels.
Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,406,027, oats 1,491,804, barley 256,370 and flarseed
19.042 bushels, while rye increased 43,950 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks
in store were as follows: wheat 257,400,076, oats 15,600,130, barley 12,930.575, flarseed 606.725 and ryo 4,016,291 bushels, a total of 290,553,797 bushels.

WINSTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Crain stocks show a net increase of 515,560 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 575,974 and rye 23,542 bushels, while decreases are shown in oats 71,180, barley 1,756 and flaxseed 13,720 bushels.


