WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending November 29 shows a slight increase of 66,434 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 10,653,996 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 265, 153, 324 bushels compared with the revised figure of 265, 086, 890 bushels for the previous week and 254,479,328 bushels for the week ending November 30, 1934. Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,845,721 bushels, a net increase of 2,432,995 bushels over the previous week's total when 30,412,726 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 1,056,979; Buffalo 21,309,000; Erie 2,402,000; New York 2,192,022; Albany 5,087,000; Galveston 213,000; Boston 64,720; Philadelphia 304,000; Baltimore 217,000 bushels. Increases are shown over the previous week's stocks at Buffalo of 1,463,000; New York 379,030; Galveston 45,000; Boston 64,720; Philadelphia 304,000 and Baltimore 217,000 Decreases are shown at Duluth and Erie of 13,755 and 26,000 bushels respectively. Stocks at Albany remained the same as those of a week ago, vir., 5,087,000 bushels. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 23,568,341 bushels distributed as follows: Duluth 1,657,768; Buffalo 13,962,458; Erie 2,205,000; New York 1,825,115; Albany 3,858,000; and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels. Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 4,591,582 bushels compared with 3,938,329 bushels for the previous week.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending November 22, 1935 amounted to 5,614,641 bushels, an increase of 1,886,696 bushels over the previous week's total when 3,727,945 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 4,205,935 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending November 22,1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Mani 236,945 (407,009); Saskatchewan 2,401,015 (1,610,652); Alberta 2,976,621 (2,188,274) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to November 22, 1935, as compared with the same period in 1934, were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 14,269,546 (25,748,901); Saskatchewan 89,626,179 (72,088,885); Alberta 57,232,677 (59,967,923) bushels. For the sixteen weeks ending November 22, 1935 and November 23, 1934, 161,128,402 bushels and 157,805,709 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending November 29, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,982,009 bushels as compared with 3,879,482 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 897,473 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1934 a decrease of 258,523 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending December 2, 1935 amounted to 7,974,000 bushels compared with 8,128,000 bushels for the preceding week and 10,224,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America showed an increase of 667,000 bushels as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Australian shipments showed decreases of 170,000 and 195,000 bushels respectively.

During the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 168 million bushels as compared with 192 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 63 million bushels as compared with 70 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 36 million bushels as compared with 66 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first eighteen weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.3 million bushels per week during the first eighteen weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.6 and 10.2 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 3.5 million bushels per week compared with 3.9 and 4.8 million bushels per week during the first eighteen weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.0 million bushels per week as compared with 3.6 million bushels per week during the same period last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 29, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain for the week ending November 29, 1935, show a net decrease of 750,805 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 265,153,324, oats 12,443,342, barley 9,059,221, flaxseed 631,562 and rye 4,578,862 bushels, a total of 291,866,311 bushels. Decreases were noted in oats of 333,205, barley 435,362, flaxseed 41,298 and rye 7,374 bushels while wheat increased 66,434 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 254,479,328, oats 15,933,023, barley 12,501,588, flaxseed 576,529 and rye 3,967,304 bushels, a total of 287,457,772 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Grain in store this week shows a net increase of 1,049,636 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,079,260, barley 23,043, flaxseed 2,014 and rye 16,688 bushels while oats decreased 71,369 bushels.



PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Wheat in store shows an increase of 219.646 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks show an increase of 15,312 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Grain in store shows a net decrease of 5,109,271 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 4,957,294, oats 70,505 and barley 117,236 bushels while flaxseed and rye increased 21,774 and 13,990 bushels respectively.

IN TRANSIT LAKES. - Grain in transit shows a net increase of 78,331 bushels. Wheat stocks increased 653,253 bushels while decreases are shown in oats of 221,403, barley 228,739 and flaxseed 124,780 bushels.


