WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 13 shows an increase of 909,300 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 10,046,442 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 267,465,682 bushels compared with the revised figure of 266,556,382 bushels for the previous week and 257,419,240 bushels for the week ending December 14, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 39,345,822 bushels, a net increase of 105,800 bushels over the previous week when 39,240,022 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 965,651; Buffalo 24,140,000; Erie 2,402,000; Chicago 321,000; New York 3,996,748; Albany 5,087,000; Galveston 142,000; Boston 738,423; Philadelphia 747,000; and Baltimore 806,000 bushels. Increases are shown in the stocks over the previous week at New York of 204,531; Boston 236,289; Philadelphia 144,000; and Baltimore 176,000 bushels, while decreases are noted at Duluth of 9,277; Buffalo 446,743 and Chicago 199,000 bushels. Stocks at Erie, Albany and Galveston remained the same as those of the previous week viz: 2,402,000; 5,087,000 and 142,000 bushels respectively. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,748,039 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 1,013,000; Duluth 1,437,261; Buffalo 15,975,441; Erie 2,500,000; Milwaukee 283,239; New York 2,468,098; Albany 4,011,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels. Wheat in transit on the lakes is reported as 78,000 bushels compared with 1,141,065 bushels for the previous week.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels, compared with 1,048,912 bushels at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending December 6 amounted to 3,232,724 bushels a decrease of 1,845,895 bushels from the previous weeks' total when 5,078,619 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,983,880 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending December 6, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 93,486 (275,585); Saskatchewan 1,033,701 (1,268,136); Alberta 2,105,537 (1,440,159) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to December 6, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 14,600,749 (26,339,156); Saskatchewan 92,770,663 (74,535,520); Alberta 62,068,333 (63,640,546) bushels. For the eighteen weeks ending December 6, 1935 and December 7, 1934, 169,439,740 and 164,515,222 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ending December 13, 1935 the export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,400,565 bushels as compared with 2,366,067 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 34,498 bushels and when compared with the same week in 1934 an increase of 845,136 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 13, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 13, 1935 show a net increase of 894,412 bushels when compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 267,465,682, oats 12,532,924, barley 9,116,976, flaxseed 538,551 and rye 4,638,961 bushels, a total of 294,293,094 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 909,300, oats 40,427 and rye 28,731 bushels while decreases are shown in barley and flaxseed of 21,206 and 62,840 bushels respectively. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 257,419,240, oats 16,300,720, barley 12,807,563, flaxseed 469,030 and rye 3,974,543 bushels, a total of 290,971,096 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net increase of 842,019 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 876,472, oats 16,584 and rye 19,279 bushels while decreases are shown in barley and flaxseed of 57,719 and 12,597 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on December 6, 1935 with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1934.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS.- Stocks for the week show an increase of 19,931 bushels, composed of wheat 1,879, oats 11,006 and barley 7,046 bushels.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 212,350 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 213,585, barley 104 and rye 257 bushels while increases are shown in oats and flaxseed of 1,523 and 73 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks show an increase of 15,672 bushels.

CHURCHILL ELEVATOR.- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain in store shows a net increase of 1,520,576 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,344,372, oats 116,500, barley 64,420 and rye 18,473 bushels while flaxseed decreased 23,189 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES.- Grain in transit show a decrease of 2,356,771 bushels composed of wheat 1,063,065, oats 1,278,583 and barley 15,123 bushels.




