WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending December 27 shows a decrease of 3,257,456 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 3,698,198 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1934. The visible supply was reported as 261,791,290 bushels compared with the revised figure of 265,048,746 bushels for the previous week and 258,093,092 bushels for the week ending December 28, 1934.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 35,312,733 bushels a decrease of 1,191,906 bushels from the previous week when 36,504,639 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 963,891; Buffalo 20,414,595; Erie 2,174,000; Chicago 315,000; New York 3,561,305; Albany 5,027,000; Galveston 114,000; Boston 1,062,942; Philadelphia 763,000 and Baltimore 852,000. Decreases are shown in the stocks from the previous week at Buffalo of 845,193; Erie 167,000; Chicago 6,000; New York 186,240; Galveston 10,000; Philadelphia 40,000, while Boston increased 62,527 bushels over the previous week. The stocks at Duluth, Albany and Baltimore remained the same as those of the previous week. For the same week a year ago the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 27,561,749 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,849,363; Buffalo 15,812,846; Erie 2,495,000; Milwankee 283,000; New York 2,136,540; Albany 4,139,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels, compared with 1,048,912 bushels at the corresponding date a year ago,

PRIMARY MOVEMENT


Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week anding December 20 amounted to 2,738,574 bushels, a decrease of 372,175 bushels from the previous week's total when 3,110,749 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 2,501,578 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending December 20, 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1934: Manitoba 38,987 (75,218); Saskatchewan 1,226,670 (800,810); Alberta 1,472,917 (1,625,550) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to December 20, 1935 as compared with the same period in 1934 were as follows, figures within brackets being those of 1934: Manitoba 14,999,195 (26,555,807); Saskatchewan 96,866,354 (76,649,250); Alberta 66,656,243 (68,922,326) bushels. For the twenty weeks ending December 20,1935 and December 21, 1934, 178,521,792 and 172,127,383 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS INTO THE UNITED STATES OF WHEAT

During the week ending December 27, 1935, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,747,317 bushels, while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 280,000 bushels of wheat. The total is 3,027,317 bushels as compared with 2,595,419 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 431,898 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1934, an increase of 2,181,763 bushels.



World shipments for the week ending December 30, 1935 amounted to 4,911,000 bushels compared with 7,585,000 bushels for the previous week and 7,000,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. World shipments showed a decrease of 2,674,000 bushels made up of 415,000 from North America, 217,000 from Argentina 906,000 from Australia and 728,000 bushels from Russia. The shipments given for North America are considerably too low.

During the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 204 million bushels as compared with 222 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 81 million bushels as compared with 79 million bushels for the same period in 1934 and Argentine shipments were 41 million bushels as compared with 74 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.



Weekly Average Shipments

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-two weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35 and 1933-34.

As shown by the above table, world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.3 million bushels per week during the first twenty-two weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 and 10.0 million bushels per week during the corresponding period in 1934-35 and 1933-34. North American shipments have averaged 3.7 million bushels per week compared with 3.6 and 4.6 million bushels per week during the first twenty-two weeks of 1934-35 and 1933-34. Argentine shipments have averaged 2.0 million bushels per week as compared with 3.4 million bushels per week during the same period last year.

An unprecedented quantity of wheat moved from the Eastern Elevators on the Georgian Bay, Lake Huron and Lower Lake Ports to the Maritime ports during the week ended December 26, 1935.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 27, 1935.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 27, 1935 show a decrease of 3,402,680 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows: wheat 261,791,290, oats 12,341,184, barley 9,102,161, flaxseed 503,306 and rye 4,661,768, bushels, a total of 288,399,709 bushels. Decreases were noted in wheat of 3,257,456, oats 79,904, barley 58,208,flaxseed 5,744 and rye 1,368 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows: wheat 258,093,092, oats 16,704,978, barley 13,183,097, flaxseed 431,815 and rye 3,961,410 bushels, a total of 292,374,392 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:— Grain stocks show a net decrease of 453,203 bushels.

Decreases are noted in wheat of 416,147, pats 16,048, barley 17,890 and flaxseed 6,579 bushels while rye increased 3,461 bushels.
