WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 10, shows a decrease of 3,817,747 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 215,674 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 256,927,907 bushels compared with the revised figure of 260,745,654 bushels for the previous week and 256,712,233 bushels for the week ending January 11, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 32,410,139 bushels, a net decrease of 2,349,384 bushels from the previous week when 34,759,523 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 895,158; Buffalo 18,981,000; Erie 1,926,000; Chicago 280,000; New York 3,260,493; Albany 4,715,000; Galveston 96,000; Boston 799,488; Philadelphia 817,000; Baltimore 572,000 and Norfolk 68,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in the Canadian wheat stocks from the previous week at Duluth of 65,400; Buffalo 899,427; Erie 123,000; New York 727,103; Albany 372,000; Galveston 16,000; Boston 263,454; while increases are noted in stocks at Philadelphia of 49,000; and Norfolk of 68,000 bushels. This is the first report from the last named port this season. Chicago and Baltimore stocks remained the same as those of the previous week viz: 280,000 and 572,000 bushels respectively. For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,838,989 bushels distributed as follows:- Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,739,374; Buffalo 15,358,565; Erie 2,454,000; Milwaukee 283,000; New York 2,019,050; Albany 4,139,000 and Philadelphia 50,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels, compared with 1,048,912 bushels at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT


Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 3, 1936 amounted to 1,142,188 bushels, a decrease of 657,182 bushels from the previous week's total when 1,799,370 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago the receipts were 830,090 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending January 3, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 108,327 (53,294); Saskatchewan 398,320 (281,846); Alberta 635,341 (494,950) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to January 3, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,207,489 (26,740,829); Saskatchewan 98,146,036 (77,632,033); Alberta 68,109,825 (70,242,611) bushels. For the twenty-two weeks ending January 3, 1936 and January 4, 1935, 181,463,350 and 174,615,473 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES

During the week ending January 10, 1936 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 2,579,299 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 629,000 bushels of wheat. The total is 3,208,299 bushels as compared with 2,029,235 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,179,064 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,405,904 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 10, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 10, 1936 show a net decrease of 4,074,502 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 256,927,907, oats 12,268,164, barley 9,076,574, flaxseed 482,258 and rye 4,689,369 bushels, a total of 283,444,272 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 3,817,747, oats 164,352 and barley 102,379 bushels, while flaxseed and rye increased 8,130 and 1,846 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 256,712,233, oats 16,792,936, barley 13,026,952, flaxseed 423,713 and rye 3,789,487 bushels, a total of 290,745,321 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 280,882 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 234,808, oats 42,402, barley 5,535 and flaxseed 3,691 bushels while rye increased 5,554 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 153,438 bushels. Wheat stocks decreased 182,965 bushels while increases are shown in oats and barley of 11,967 and 17,560 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 234,185 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 201,467 and oats 35,548 bushels while decreases are shown in barley and flaxseed of 2,689 and 141 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain in store remains the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain stocks show a net increase of 68,083 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 138,525, barley 8,520 and rye 4,260 bushels, while oats and flaxseed decreased 71,870 and 11,352 bushels respectively.




