WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 17, shows a decrease of 4,027,234 bushels compared with the previous week and an increase of 1,464,802 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 252,271,644 bushels compared with the revised figure of 256,298,878 bushels for the previous week and 253,736,446 bushels for the week ending January 18, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 31,246,437 bushels, a net decrease of 1,163,702 bushels from the previous week when 32,410,139 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in store in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 842,255; Buffalo 18,036,000; Erie 1,875,000; Chicago 247,000; New York 3,117,701; Albany 4,715,000; Galveston 84,000; Boston 1,012,481; Philadelphia 735,000 and Baltimore 532,000 bushels. Decreases are shown in all the ports except Boston, which increased the Canadian wheat in store by 212,993 bushels over that of the previous week. The decreases by ports were - Duluth 52,903; Buffalo 895,000; Erie 51,000; Chicago 33,000; New York 142,792; Galveston 12,000; Philadelphia 82,000; Baltimore 40,000 and Norfolk 68,000 bushels. The stocks at Albany remained the same as the previous week viz: 4,715,000 bushels.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 26,164,012 bushels distributed as follows:- Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,739,374; Buffalo 15,066,762; Erie 2,290,000; Milwaukee 283,000; New York 1,799,876; Albany 4,139,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels, compared with 1,048,912 bushels at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 10, 1936 amounted to 450,516 bushels, less than half of those of the previous week, when 1,142,188 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 1,070,442 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending January 10, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 31,574 (56,662); Saskatchewan 236,870 (399,292); Alberta 182,072 (614,488) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to January 10, 1936 as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,239,063 (26,797,491); Saskatchewan 98,382,906 (78,031,325); Alberta 68,291,897 (70,857,099) bushels. For the twenty-three weeks ending January 10, 1936 and January 11, 1935, 181,913,366 and 175,685,915 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES.

During the week ending January 17, 1936 the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,407,812 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 638,000 bushels of wheat. The total is 4,045,812 bushels as compared with 3,208,299 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 837,513 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 2,098,911 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending January 18, 1936 amounted to 7,546,000 bushels as compared with 8,170,000 bushels for the previous week and 9,488,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed slight increases as compared with the previous week while Argentine and Russian shipments showed decreases of 431,000 and 1,016,000 bushels respectively.

During the first twenty-four weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 226 million bushels as compared with 243 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 91 million bushels as compared with 83 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 42 million bushels as compared with 82 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat for the first twenty-four weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35.

As shown by the above world shipments of wheat have averaged 9.4 million bushels per week during the first 24 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 3.8 million bushels per week compared with 3.4 million bushels per week during the same period 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.8 million bushels per week as compared with 3.4 in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 17, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 17, 1936 show a decrease of 4,331,030 bushels, compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 252,271,644, oats 12,111,442, barley 8,883,164, flaxseed 477,302 and rye 4,686,996 bushels, a total of 278,430,548 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 4,027,234, oats 69,655, barley 210,984, flaxseed 14,080 and rye 9,077 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 253,736,446, oats 16,072,873, barley 12,880,212, flaxseed 421,079 and rye 3,884,812 bushels, a total of 286,995,422 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 741,335 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 644,430, oats 45,641, barley 47,688 and flaxseed 6,822 bushels while rye increased 3,246 bushels.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 27,425 bushels. Wheat stocks decreased 65,828 bushels while oats and barley increased 37,151 and 1,252 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 286,338 bushels. Wheat stocks decreased 337,461 bushels while increases are noted in oats and barley of 49,409 and 1,714 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks remain unchanged.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Grain in store shows a net increase of 216,588 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 187,068, oats 20,956 and barley 10,442 bushels while flaxseed decreased 1,878 bushels.

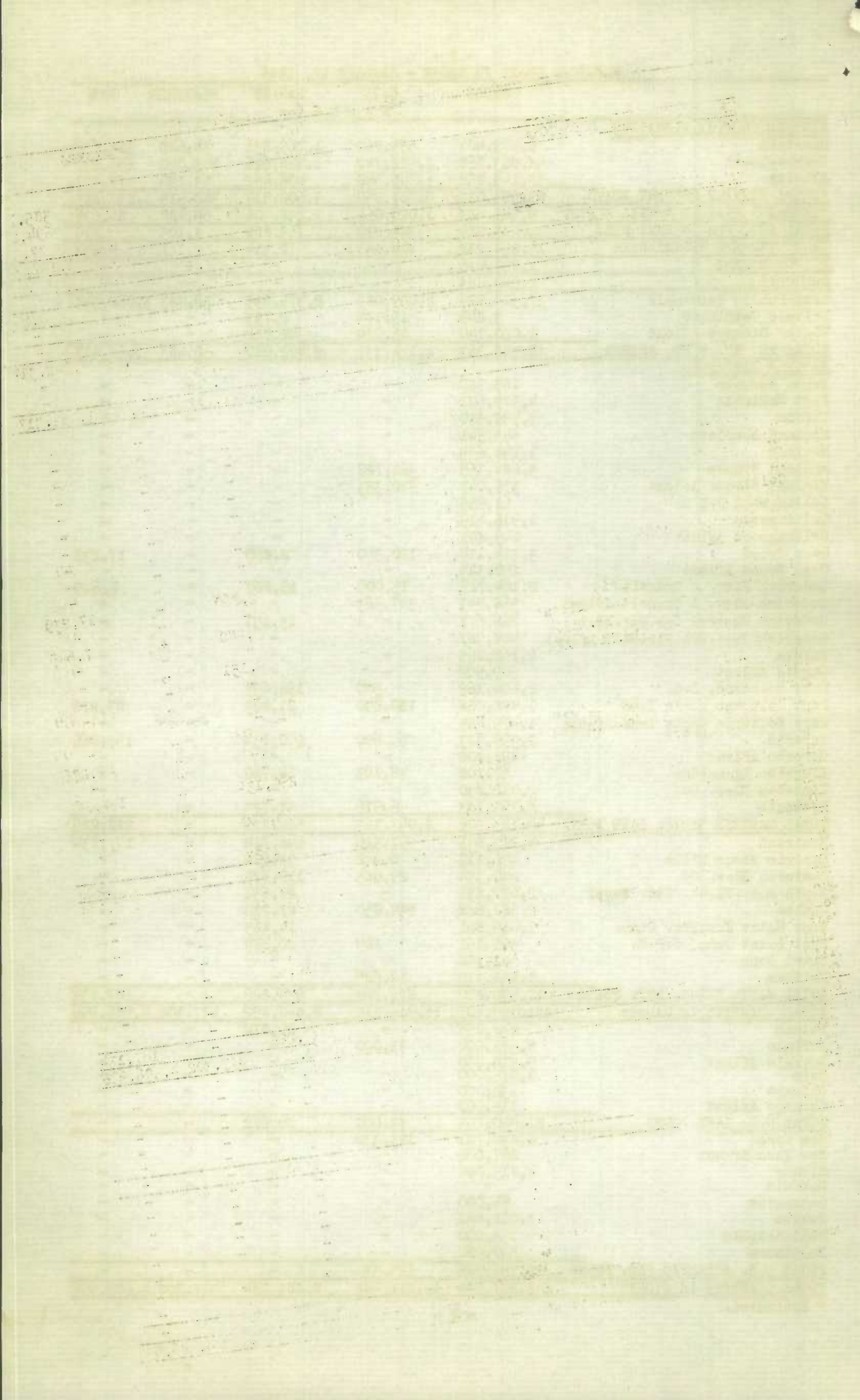
