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WHEAT STOCKS IN STORE

Canadian wheat in store for the week ending January 24 shows a decrease of 4,015,131 bushels compared with the previous week and a decrease of 2,336,148 bushels compared with the corresponding week in 1935. The visible supply was reported as 247,783,565 bushels compared with the revised figure of 251,798,696 bushels for the previous week and 250,119,713 bushels for the week ending January 25, 1935.

Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 29,854,814 bushels, a net decrease of 1,391,623 bushels from the previous week, when 31,246,437 bushels were reported. The Canadian wheat in the United States is located at the following ports: Duluth 822,505; Buffalo 17,225,000; Erie 1,845,000; Chicago 247,000; New York 2,879,382; Albany 4,715,000; Norfolk 82,000; Galveston 77,000; Boston 879,927; Philadelphia 750,000 and Baltimore 332,000. Decreases are shown in all the ports except Philadelphia and Norfolk which increased 15,000 and 82,000 bushels respectively. The decreases by ports were: Duluth 19,750; Buffalo 861,000; Erie 30,000; New York 238,319; Galveston 7,000; Boston 132,554; and Baltimore 200,000 bushels. The stocks at Albany and Chicago remained the same as those of the previous week viz: 4,715,000 and 247,000 bushels respectively.

For the same week a year ago, the Canadian wheat in the United States amounted to 25,818,910 bushels distributed as follows: Chicago 786,000; Duluth 1,739,374; Buffalo 14,936,908; Erie 2,210,000; Milwaukee 283,000; New York 1,664,628; Albany 4,139,000 and Philadelphia 60,000 bushels.

United States wheat in Canada is shown as 2 bushels, compared with 1,048,912 bushels at the corresponding date a year ago.

PRIMARY MOVEMENT

Wheat marketings in the Prairie Provinces for the week ending January 17, 1936 amounted to 819,281 bushels, almost twice the quantity of the previous week when 450,516 bushels were marketed. During the corresponding week a year ago, the receipts were 851,001 bushels. By provinces, the receipts for the week ending January 17, 1936 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 80,507 (34,326) Saskatchewan 353,714 (272,357); Alberta 385,060 (544,318) bushels. Marketings of wheat in the three Prairie Provinces from August 1 to January 17, 1936, as compared with the same period in 1935 were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1935: Manitoba 15,319,570 (26,831,817); Saskatchewan 98,736,620 (78,303,682); Alberta 68,676,957 (71,401,417) bushels. For the twenty-four weeks ending January 17, 1936 and January 18, 1935, 182,733,147 and 176,536,916 bushels were received from the farms.

OVERSEAS EXPORT CLEARANCES AND IMPORTS OF WHEAT INTO THE UNITED STATES.

During the week ending January 24, 1936, the overseas export clearances of wheat amounted to 3,193,788 bushels while imports into the United States for consumption and milling in bond were 801,000 bushels of wheat. The total is 3,994,788 bushels as compared with 4,045,812 bushels for the previous week, a decrease of 51,024 bushels, and when compared with the same week in 1935, an increase of 1,746,644 bushels.

World shipments for the week ending January 25, 1936 amounted to 10,738,000 bushels as compared with 8,170,000 bushels for the previous week and 10,736,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from North America and Australia showed increases of 1,183,000 bushels and 938,000 bushels respectively as compared with the previous week while Argentine shipments showed a slight decrease.

During the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year world shipments amounted to 236 million bushels as compared with 254 million bushels for the corresponding weeks last year. Australian shipments were slightly lower than last year. North American shipments were 96 million bushels as compared with 85 million bushels for the same period in 1934-35 and Argentine shipments were only 42 million bushels as compared with 86 million bushels for the corresponding period last year.

The following table shows the weekly average shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the first twenty-five weeks of the present crop year along with comparative figures for 1934-35.

As shown by the above, shipments of wheat have averaged 9.5 million bushels per week during the first 25 weeks of the crop year as compared with 10.1 million bushels for the corresponding period last year. North American shipments have averaged 3.9 million bushels per week compared with 3.4 million bushels per week during the same period 1934-35. Argentine shipments have averaged 1.7 million bushels per week as compared with 3.5 in 1934-35.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 24, 1936.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 24, 1936 show a net decrease of 4,161,506 bushels compared with the revised figure of the previous week. Stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 247,783,565, oats 12,042,530, barley 8,907,056, flaxseed 461,355 and rye 4,654,694 bushels, a total of 273,849,200 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 4,015,131, oats 118,310, flaxseed 16,109 and rye 32,966 bushels while barley increased 21,010 bushels. At a comparable date last year stocks in store were as follows:- wheat 250,119,713, oats 15,697,369, barley 12,376,749, flaxseed 415,449 and rye 3,910,058 bushels, a total of 282,519,338 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Grain in store shows a net decrease of 991,176 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 993,133, flaxseed 7,429 and rye 149 bushels while oats and barley increased 4,811 and 4,724 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR PUBLIC AND SEMI-PUBLIC TERMINALS. Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 175,761 bushels. Wheat stocks decreased 191,254 bushels while increases are shown in oats and barley 14,826 and 667 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER-NEW WESTMINSTER ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 354,874 bushels, composed of wheat 354,255, oats 225 and barley 394 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND CHURCHILL ELEVATORS.- Grain in store remain unchanged.
